# Plan for Return to School

#### Teacher Preparation and Planning Days for Third - Sixth Grade

- Monday, December 14
- Additional Dates to be shared as they are announced

Teacher preparation and planning days - There will be no synchronous instruction. Students will be sent a Google link to log in for attendance.

Students may work on unfinished work, engage in off screen activities, choice boards on online learning programs independently.

# Current Health Thresholds Impact on In-Person Instruction

In order for a group to **BEGIN** in-person instruction:

The established thresholds for the **group** must be met for **BOTH** the number of cases per 100,000 persons <u>and</u> the percent positivity for seven (7) consecutive calendar days.

In order to for a **group** to **REMAIN** in in-person instruction:

The number of cases per 100,000 persons <u>or</u> the percent positivity for may not exceed the established threshold for the group for seven (7) consecutive calendar days.

Groups will transition back to **DISTANCE LEARNING** if:

The number of cases per 100,000 persons <u>or</u> the percent positivity exceeds the established threshold for the group for seven (7) consecutive calendar days.

# **Health Metrics Monitored**

- 1. Total number of new cases per 100,000 persons within the last 14 days.
- 2. Percentage of tests that are positive during the last 14 days.
- 3. Ability of the school to implement key mitigation strategies


### Heath Metrics #1 & #2 - VDH

#### Core Indicators, Fairfax, 12/6/2020

Total number of new cases per 100,000 persons within the last 14 days\*

Percentage of RT-PCR tests that are positive during the last 14 days\*\*

Ability of the school to implement five key mitigation strategies



VDH does not have these data. CDC recommends self-assessment measuring a school's ability to implement consistent and correct use of masks, social distancing, hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette, cleaning and disinfection, and contact tracing in collaboration with the local health department.

# CDC Metric #3: School's ability to implement health and safety measures to stem the spread of the virus even when the first two measures remain elevated.

What does this look like?

1. School Safety Visits



- 2. Implementation of Key Mitigation Strategies
  - Proper use of masks or face coverings
  - Social distancing
  - Hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette
  - Cleaning and disinfection
  - Contact tracing in collaboration with the health department



Success in returning students to school will rely on the proper implementation of this third core metric.

### In Person Concurrent Classroom



# What will my child's class look like?

#### 1. Virtual

 Students stay home and learn virtually through the computer 4 days per week (Tuesday - Friday)

#### 2. In Person Concurrently

- Students will come to school 2 days per week (Tuesday & Wednesday) OR (Thursday & Friday)
- Students in the in person cohorts will also receive 4 days of instruction (2 days in person and 2 days virtual)

Communication regarding which days your students will attend in person will mailed.

## **School Decision Making Process**

#### Will we be able to keep our same teacher?

- We will do our best to keep a majority of class placements the same, but we cannot guarantee this as we will be encountering several staffing challenges that will require us to change class placements.
- The student/family needs and our staffing needs vary by grade level and we will come up with the best model for each.

#### What are the different instructional models?

- Concurrent class has a mix of virtual students and in person students
- Virtual Class Students are assigned to a teacher who is virtual and all students in the class are virtual
- If your child has a teacher who is teaching virtually, there will be in person support. Classroom monitors are being hired for these roles.

# **Survey Results - Third - Sixth Grade**

	In Person Half attend Tues/Wed, Half attend Thurs/Fri	Virtual
Third Grade	58	55
Fourth Grade	53	47
Fifth Grade	70	43
Sixth Grade	65	57

Each classroom will have 10 or fewer students in person each day. Classes will have approximately 15-19 students virtually each day.

# **Cohort Assignments**

Students will be assigned to Group A - Tuesday / Wednesday OR Group B - Thursday / Friday if they have selected to return to school in person.

Siblings will be matched so that students in the same family come to school on the same days.

Student needs will be the primary consideration for teachers as they are forming groups for in person instruction.

Communication regarding which days your students will attend in person will mailed.

# What will a school day look like? ALL STUDENTS

- participate in morning meeting with their peers
- have synchronous whole group and small group instruction with their teacher
- engage in language arts, math, science and social studies instruction
- use online programs to support their learning
- complete assignments and assessments of learning
- have access to educational materials to support their learning
- follow the same bell schedule
- participate in Specials classes (Art, Music, PE, Library)
- Use choice boards and off screen activities for learning on Mondays

# Virtual vs. In person

Virtual Students will	In person students will

# **Classroom Cohorts / Groups**

- In order to mitigate health risks, we will limit mixing of students across classes at this time.
- Students will remain in the classroom of their assigned cohort
- Students may receive services virtually from the building so that teachers may avoid mixing cohorts
- Students in small groups must remain 6ft apart to the greatest extent possible.
- Plexiglass has been installed in classrooms for all small group tables.
- All staff members and students are expected to wear masks at all times.

## How are we preparing for students?





- Consistent and correct use of masks
- Social distancing to the largest extent possible
- Hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette
- Cleaning and disinfection
- Contact tracing in collaboration with local health department





## **Daily Schedule**

Each day will begin with morning meeting for all students

- Instructional blocks will occur at the same time in person as virtual
- When in person students have handwashing breaks and are learning procedures and routines, virtual students will engage in asynchronous work.
- Small group instruction will be modified as the concurrent model is launched.

Your child's teacher will provide a detailed schedule of the day as the return date approaches.

# **Bell Schedules & Transportation**

The school day for all students will be 8:45-3:30. Once all students return, the bell schedule will likely be modified.

Kiss and Ride: Students remain in the car until temperature is checked. All families will receive a sign for their car indicating student name and grade to post in car window for kiss and ride.

Walkers: Parents may walk their child to Door #6 to have their temperature taken. Students will enter the building with an adult monitor.

Buses: Parents may be asked to come to the bus stop with children. Temperatures will be taken upon arrival at school. Staff will support children in getting to classrooms from the bus.

#### **Breakfast**

- Breakfast will be provided for all students.
- Breakfast will be individually packaged and eaten in the classroom.

#### Lunch

- Students will eat lunch in their classrooms or outside with social distancing, weather permitting.
- Families may send a towel to school for students to sit and eat outside
- School lunches will be individually packaged.

#### Recess

- Areas will be marked off into 'play zones' so that students may socially distance
- Playground equipment will not be used
- Hand sanitizer will be used at recess
- Used equipment will be cleaned after use
- Students will keep masks on at recess

## **|Specials**

Students will continue to have Art, PE, Library and Music. All specials classes have specific Health and Safety Guidelines that they will follow to ensure the safest instruction for students.

Students will go to the Gym, the Art Room and Music for specials. Librarians will come to the classroom to teach.


Some specialists will teach virtually and students who are in person will follow along with the SMARTBoard in their classroom. Instructional aides, classroom monitors or another staff member will be in the classroom during specials to monitor students.

#### **Bathrooms**

- Students will use bathrooms in their classrooms if they have them throughout the day.
- Each bathroom has a hand sanitizing station outside the bathroom to be used before and after.
- Students will wash hands for 20 seconds after using the bathroom.
- Sinks and doorknobs will be wiped down frequently.

## What to Bring to School

- Refillable water bottle, community water fountains will not be used
- Students should arrive wearing a mask, if not, one will be provided
- Breakfast and lunch will be provided
- Students may also bring a packed lunch



Classroom teachers will communicate with families about specific items that students need to bring, including when laptops will be needed at school.


### **Health Screening Commitment Form**

#### Important!

Parents/guardians who chose in-school instruction for their child will be required to complete a <a href="Parent/Guardian Health Screening Commitment form">Parent/Guardian Health Screening Commitment form</a> as students are phased back into in-person learning.

The document indicates the parental/guardian's agreement and commitment to completing a daily health screening prior to sending the student to school and also to keep ill students at home. These health screenings will be done on an honor basis and will not be required to be submitted to the school each day.

Families can complete this form in <u>ParentVue</u> – OR – submit the form to your child(ren's) school.



# **Cleaning Protocols**



#### Refreshed Cleaning Methods/Processes

FCPS cleaning personnel will be sanitizing and disinfecting more frequently. Their cleaning protocol will include thoroughly disinfecting and sanitizing all surfaces, doors, toilets, and handles, and ensuring that all supplies are always fully stocked.

#### Increased Cleaning to High-Touch Surfaces/Points

FCPS cleaning crews will be sanitizing touch surfaces/points thoroughly such as door handles, glass, elevators buttons, doors, tables, chairs, and light switches. Daytime custodians have been instructed to continuously disinfect and sanitize all touch points throughout the day. In addition, we will be increasing daytime custodian coverage where appropriate, depending on building occupancy.

# Face Coverings & Social Distancing

- All students who are two years old and up are required to wear face coverings (cloth or disposable) while on school property.
- Face coverings will be provided to students unable to provide their own.
- Six foot separation wherever possible; limited mixing among student groups
- Desks/seats will be separated by six feet, facing the same direction.

## **Daily Temperature Checks**



FCPS will be doing daily temperature checks. Please be aware that these protocols may change based on public health guidance.

**Bus Stop**: Parents and guardians of elementary students in grades PreK-6 may be required to accompany their child at the bus stop each day.

**School Entry**: Temperatures will be taken for all students entering the building.

**During School**: Temperatures will be taken throughout the day for any student who:

- Arrives late to school.
- Takes off their face mask during the day and refuses to put it back on. This requirement does not apply when students are eating and drinking, sleeping, or during exercise, under the supervision of school staff.

At any time, if the temperature of a student is greater than or equal to 100.4° Fahrenheit, the student will be taken to the Care Room for further screening.

## **Bus Transportation**



- Parents will receive information about bus schedules prior to start.
- Seating capacity will be reduced to allow for social distancing.
- Parents and guardians of elementary students in grades PreK-6
  may be required to accompany their child at the bus stop each
  day.
- Students are reminded to wear a face coverings when riding the school bus.
- Students will be required to sit in seats as marked on the school bus.
- Siblings may sit together on the bus.

# SACC

As of now, we have no information regarding whether SACC will have before school or after care for FCPS students.

## **Preparing your Children to Return**

If you selected in-person learning for your child, please continue doing the following in preparation for the return to school:

- Talk to your children about what school will be like when they return.
- Ask if they have questions and let them know we are all going to work together to keep everyone safe and healthy.
- Practice wearing a mask or face covering during the day.
- Practice opening food containers and packing up their items in a backpack.
- Discuss the importance of social distancing.
- Talk about washing hands and covering coughs and sneezes.

#### Virtual Back to School Sessions

Teachers will hold Virtual Back to School Sessions for their families to provide an orientation of the classroom set up, daily schedule and what to expect in the first days as students return to school concurrently.

Session links and times will be shared by your child's teacher.
