

Did you know?

- ▲ 1 in 4 children is abused.
- ▲ Child abuse can happen to children of any age, culture or socioeconomic level.
- ▲ Children rarely lie about being abused.
- ▲ 90% of child abusers are known by the child, and 68% are family members.

Effective prevention education programs have been shown to empower children to identify unsafe situations before they are abused, or recognize current or prior abuse and seek help.

**Preventing abuse through
empowering children.**



5 key body safety rules children will learn:

It's MY Body

Your body belongs to you.

Ask an Adult if I'm Safe

Identify safe adults.

I Have Choices

Know what to do if no safe adults are available.

Tell Someone

Share uncomfortable feelings and situations with safe adults.

It's NEVER My Fault

Understand abuse is NEVER a child's fault.

What is Body Safety?

Children, ages 4-12 years old, in the Body Safety Program learn what abuse is and how they can resist when they feel unsafe.

The Body Safety program uses the Childhelp® Speak Up Be Safe curriculum* to educate and empower children.

The Body Safety program is offered at **NO COST** to participants and is presented in partnership with Fairfax County Public Schools, other county agencies, community centers, and community and faith-based organizations.

The Body Safety program provides your school or organization with:

- ▲ A free 2-hour body safety class using the Childhelp® Speak Up Be Safe Curriculum for children in pre-school - 6th grade.
- ▲ An age-appropriate curriculum that builds a child's safety skills, and helps them identify risks such as cyberbullying, internet safety, child abuse and child sexual abuse.
- ▲ Pre- and post-class surveys for the children.
- ▲ An optional separate presentation for parents and guardians.
- ▲ Parent/teacher handouts/activities available upon request.

Volunteer!

Volunteer facilitators are needed to support the county's Body Safety Program for children. After successfully completing background checks, volunteers receive training and certification in teaching children the Childhelp® Speak Up Be Safe Curriculum.

Volunteers should:

- ▲ Be at least 21 years of age.
- ▲ Be available to teach during school hours.
- ▲ Enjoy teaching school-age children.
- ▲ Commit to leading at least 10, 2-hour classes in a year.
