## Health Services Kindergarten Orientation

A partnership between Fairfax County Health Department and FCPS

#### Goal of the Health Room

The goal of this partnership is to promote a safe and healthy environment in which to maximize your child's educational experience





#### Role- Public Health Nurse

- Act as a liaison between Health Department and FCPS
- Identify and address medical and health concerns of students
- Provide training for school staff about health issues and procedures
- Resource to school staff for communicable diseases and appropriate actions to address
- Promote healthy lifestyles and teach health related topics
- Keep school community informed of Health Department resources
- Supervise School Health Aide
- Work at multiple FCPS schools





#### Role- School Health Aide

- Paraprofessional trained by the Health Department
- Narrow scope of practice to include:
  - Care for sick and injured students
  - Facilitate medication administration
  - Coordinate Vision and Hearing screening
  - Tracks illness trends
  - School Health Aide is not a nurse and can not diagnose or give advice regarding care





#### What Parents Need to Know...

- Complete the Health Information Form. Update this form during the year as necessary
- Complete the Emergency Care Card
- Keep emergency contact information current and updated
- Parents must provide any medication that their child might need during the school year
- All medication must be accompanied by FCPS medication form available on the FCPS website or in the health room
- Students are not allowed to carry medications to school

#### Children are sent home...

#### Symptoms of COVID-19 that are not caused by an alternate diagnosis:

- Fever of 100.4 degrees or above
- Headache
- Difficult breathing/Shortness of Breath
- New Cough
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- Congestion/runny nose
- Fatigue
- New muscle pain
- Abdominal pain
- New loss of taste, smell, or appetite

#### Symptoms of Other Communicable Diseases:

- · Skin conditions and rashes
- Eye discharge





#### **General Information**

- If your child is sick, please keep your child at home until symptoms have been resolved for 24 hours without medication
- Please state symptoms your child is experiencing when you call the
   Attendance line
- Students generally can only stay 15 minutes in the Health Room, and then a decision is made to go back to class or home



#### Who are the School Bus Drivers?

#### **Trained Career Professionals**

- Licensed by Federal Regulations and holding a Commercial Drivers License
  - Driving records monitored
- Successfully complete Fairfax County Public School bus driver training course
  - Recertified every 5 years
- CPR and First Aid Trained
  - Recertified every 2 years





#### How do we assist with your child's transition?

- Your bus driver is the first school personnel to greet your child
- Provide safe transportation for all students
- Teach children how to ride the bus with their peers safely
- All Kindergartners ride the big bus, at a neighborhood bus stop





#### How does a bus driver know,

"Who is a Kindergartener?"

This is important information to a substitute bus driver.





#### Kindergarten Procedures for the Big Bus

All Kindergartners must be met by an adult at the <u>Bus Door</u> and asked for <u>by name</u> by the parent, parent designee, guardian, or a responsible middle school or higher sibling <u>every day</u>.

#### No Exceptions to this rule!





#### Kindergarten Procedures for the Big Bus

- "K" students are first on and first off the bus
- "K" students and Special Needs students sit in the front of the bus.
- Driver and patrols monitor interactions between "K" students and other students
- "K" students are escorted to and from the bus by teachers or patrols
- All students are expected to remain in their seats, with classroom behaviors and voices





#### **General Transportation Information**

- Parents do <u>not</u> receive phone calls from drivers but receive bus information from the school in August
- Daycare must be within the school boundary
- IEP issues, concerning transportation, are addressed on a case-by-case basis at IEP meetings
- Walking boundaries are up to 1 mile from school
  - -Except when there are unusual hazards

#### **Arrival**

Students should start their arrival routine on the first day of school

- Kiss & Ride
- Walkers
- School Bus
- Daycare Vans
- Student-Age Child Care (SACC)

The first 2 weeks of school, staff will walk all kindergarten students to their classrooms



- Please be sure the colored classroom tag is attached to their backpack on the first day
- Do not put any personal info on the tag or on the outside of their backpack

#### **Dismissal**

Make sure that your child knows how they will be going home every day.

- Bus #, Kiss & Ride, walker, daycare, or SACC should be written on the back of their colored classroom tag
- Keep dismissal procedures consistent, all changes must be in writing or called into the office
- Teachers will walk students to buses and daycare vans and will ensure that they are on the correct bus.
- Kindergarten IAs will walk SACC students to their classroom at the end of the day, and will wait at the front of the school with Kiss & Ride and walking students for parents






