

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## Language Arts

By the end of the 2022-23 school year, 100% of students will meet their growth target on the reading iReady Universal Screener.

#### **Strategy 1**

Grade level teachers will plan and implement interactive read alouds of complex texts to build language comprehension skills and vocabulary.

#### **Strategy 2**

Grade level teachers will plan and explicitly teach high level language skills (eg. inferencing, comprehension monitoring, and awareness of text structure).

#### **Strategy 3**

Grade level teachers will utilize Lexia Core5/Power Up to provide access to structured literacy to all students.

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### Mathematics

## By the end of the 2022-23 school year, 100% of students will meet their growth target on the math iReady Universal Screener.

#### **Strategy 1**

 Grade level teachers will utilize the math workshop model to provide tier 1 instruction for all students.

#### **Strategy 2**

 Grade level teachers will use data to inform practices and provide math interventions and/or enrichment.

#### **Strategy 3**

• Grade level teachers will provide time for students to engage with mathematical problems that elicit multiple representations in order to promote student discourse.

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### Hellness

Outcome: Ensure students feel safe, included, and supported in the school environment.

**Goal:** By the end of the 22-23 school year, reports of disruptions and touching/pushing/shoving will be reduced by 5% as documented through the Tier 1 Behavior Log.

#### Strategy 1

Staff will implement Responsive Classroom practices including Morning Meeting, Take a Break spots, and RC language for reinforcing, reminding, and redirecting.

#### Strategy 2

Small groups and 1:1 support will be provided through the Clinical Team from the Social Thinking curriculum.

#### Strategy 3

All students will receive Zones of Regulation curriculum for Tier 1 instruction through biweekly or monthly counseling lessons.

## Portrait of a Graduate

## All Students will complete a POG Presentation of Learning (POL) by 2025-2026.

**Goal:** By the end of the 22-23 school year, 100% of students will demonstrate increased understanding of POG and an increase in student engagement as reported on a student survey given at the beginning, middle, and end of the year.

#### **Strategy 1**

Collaborative teams will align content knowledge and skills with POG attribute and skills.

#### **Strategy 2**

Teachers will design and facilitate inquiry-based opportunities that elevate student voice and increase student engagement.

#### **Strategy 3**

The school will build an understanding with students, staff, and the community about why POG attributes and skills positively impact students within and beyond school.
