Hispanic Leadership Alliance Scholarship Program Application for 2023

The **Hispanic Leadership Alliance** (HLA) scholarship is for a first-generation Latinx student from Fairfax County Public Schools. A first-generation Latinx student is one born abroad or to immigrant parents in the United States. The student must be the first one in his or her family to attend a post-secondary educational institution. HLA is a non-profit organization of Fairfax County Public Schools employees, retirees, former students, and residents. Among the goals of HLA are to develop partnership relationships with school-based Latinx clubs; provide leadership training opportunities to club members; encourage student participation in advanced academic programs, leadership activities, and school completion; and support Latinx graduating seniors with schoolarship opportunities.

In 2005 HLA established a scholarship program for first-generation Latinx students* of Fairfax County Public Schools who plan to attend a post-secondary educational institution. HLA will award **twenty-six** \$1,000 scholarships at the Eighteenth Annual HLA Scholarship Celebration and Banquet on May 9, 2023.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the scholarships offered by the **Hispanic Leadership Alliance**, a first-generation* Latinx high school senior of Fairfax County Public Schools must identify his or her career choices and also the name of the accredited college, technical school, or university he or she plans to attend. The scholarship must be disbursed no later than September 1, 2024.

Evaluation Criteria

Applicants are evaluated based on the following criteria:

- 1. Student application (including student essay);
- 2. Two recommendations (an academic recommendation from a current teacher and a personal recommendation from a guidance counselor or community leader).

Application Process

- 1. Student must complete the application form.
- 2. Student must give and collect the two recommendation forms to the selected references prior to the deadline in order to submit with the application packet. Counselors and community members may also email the recommendation letter to jane.ellen.cruz@gmail.com.
- 3. Student is responsible for submitting all the parts of the completed application online to Jane Cruz, scholarship chair, at <u>jane.ellen.cruz@gmail.com</u> by Monday, February 27, 2023. No applications will be accepted after midnight, February 27, 2023.

Selection Process

The HLA Scholarship Committee, comprised of HLA board members and FCPS administrators, will read and evaluate the applications and select the 2023 recipients.

Award Presentation

Hispanic Leadership Alliance will host a scholarship celebration and banquet on Tuesday, May 9, 2023, to present scholarships to the selected recipients.
