
Fun Fact

The Real St. Patrick Was Born in Britain

Much of what is known about St. Patrick's life has been interwoven with folklore and legend. Historians generally believe that St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, was born in Britain (not Ireland) near the end of the 4th century. At age 16 he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and sold as a slave to a Celtic priest in Northern Ireland. After toiling for six years as a shepherd, he escaped back to Britain. He eventually returned to Ireland as a Christian missionary.

IMMUNIZATIONS

For children and adults, including immunizations required for school and international travel.

MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

Services for pregnant people and new mothers including prenatal care, dental care, nutrition services, safety seat distribution, and home visits.

HIV SERVICES

HIV testing, prevention education and counseling, and HIV/AIDS care and treatment support.

STI SERVICES

Screening, testing, treatment and counseling.

TUBERCULOSIS (TB) SERVICES

Testing and treatment.

PREGNANCY TESTING

Testing, counseling and links to resources.

VITAL RECORDS

Get certified copies of vital records including birth, death, marriage, and divorce certificates.

NUTRITION

However, Indigenous communities in U.S. may be "hidden" if schools assume that these students are primarily Spanish speakers and Indigenous families don't feel comfortable sharing more about their backgrounds. In addition, schools may not know how to provide language access for families who speak Indigenous languages.

- Photo ID for everyone 18 or older in the household
- Current school records for everyone of school age in the household
- Birth certificates for children in the household
- Proof of all income for all adults in the household
 - 2-3 Paystubs
 - Bank statement showing deposits (cross through any account numbers or sensitive information), and/or benefits letter(s)
- Proof of residence for all adults in household:
 - Lease and current utility bill

3. Attend Your Scheduled Appointment

Attend your scheduled appointment to discuss the services for which you may qualify. Be prepared for your appointment to last up to an hour.

FOOD PANTRY

Featuring a "choice model" pantry

Western Fairfax Christian Ministries offers a "choice model" pantry which empowers our clients. Our clients can come into our food pantry and select food as they would at a grocery store by picking their own food items from the shelves. We do everything we can to continually stock all the items that would make a fully nutritious meal. Products include non-perishable items such as canned goods, as well as bread, produce, meat, and dairy products. In addition to food items, we also carry baby-specific items such as diapers and baby food for those who have infants.

We know that food can be one of the most expensive items on a household budget list. Our hope is that when clients select food in our pantry every 30 days (providing food for about two weeks) they will save enough money to pay for other expenses such as utility bills while remaining food secure with free nutritious food options for their families.

FINANCIAL COUNSELING

Western Fairfax Christian Ministries partners with **Britepaths** to provide several class options each month in English and Spanish to meet our client's needs. Classes cover basic budgeting fundamentals.

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
