We had a good turnout at our school counselor coffee in February, where we discussed internet safety for our children. We highly encourage parents to monitor their children's device usage, whether the school device or a device from home.

March lessons focused on attendance and test taking strategies. We love to see your children here every day they are well enough to attend! We encouraged students to make sure they stay home with a fever, vomiting or other communicable illness. However, mild headaches, tummy aches, and seasonal runny noses are things we must deal with and still attend school.

When we return in April, our Kindergarten and first grade lessons will focus on resiliency, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, making good decisions and 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>, personal responsibility and accountability.

In May, our Family Liaison office is hosting a workshop for our Spanish speaking families sponsored by Edu-Futuro. Edu-Futuro partners with FCPS to "empower students, engage parents and transform communities to break the cycle of poverty by engaging and empowering underserved Latino and immigrant youth and families through mentorship, education, leadership development, parent engagement, individual case management, and workforce development." Programs are offered throughout a student's education to open doors to post-secondary opportunities such as college, employment and trade schools. Snacks and childcare will be provided.
