What about the ACT?

The ACT will continue to be offered as a paper-based test. There will be an option to take the test on a computer at select test centers starting in late 2023 and early 2024, but the computer-based test will be identical to the paper test in length and format.



? A lot of colleges are now "testoptional." Does that mean I don't have to test?

Test-optional means you have the option to submit test scores (or not) when you apply. We recommend taking a practice test to see how you'd score. Strong scores show that you're ready for college and can often open the doors to admission and scholarship offers, even at test-optional schools.

Poes the digital SAT offer any advantages?

The new SAT has certain features that many students may find advantageous, including:

- Shorter test
- More time per question
- Shorter reading passages
- Faster score delivery
- Built-in graphing calculator
- A way to flag questions in order to come back to them later
- A countdown clock, which you can show or hide
- A reference sheet of common math formulas
- For students who take a hybrid (paper/digital) approach, will colleges superscore the paper and digital SAT?

The College Board says that colleges plan to use "scores from the digital test as they do now." This suggests that colleges that currently superscore will continue to do so across testing formats. Each college sets their own policy, so be sure to check with the schools on your list.
