National Family Engagement Month Suggested Activities and Resources November 2023

November is National Family Engagement Month! This month reminds us that families are children's first and most important teachers, advocates, and nurturers. Over 35 years of research shows that the most effective way to increase student achievement is for families to be actively involved in the education of their children. The importance of family engagement will be highlighted during the month of November as we celebrate and strengthen family-school partnerships together.

This toolkit provides opportunities for a strengths-based approach to family engagement as schools celebrate family-school partnerships throughout the month of November and beyond.



Ideas for Schools

- Utilize FCPS graphics to post opportunities on social media posting using #FCPSEngageFamilies or <u>#FamilyEngagementMonth</u> and tag <u>@FSP_FCPS</u>& @FRC_FCPS
- Host a Principal or Family Coffee.
- **Mobilize** family volunteers to support a school effort.
- Invite families to visit classrooms to share diverse family traditions during morning meetings.
- Celebrate National Family Engagement Day on November 16, 2023, by welcoming families to eat lunch or volunteer at their child's school.
- Write thank you letters or postcards to families for National Family Engagement Day on November 16, 2023.
- Have students and families create a family project to create home-school connections.
- **Encourage** teachers to send a positive note or postcard home to families or one class period at the secondary levels.
- **Display** family-focused library books for students to check out during the month.
- Encourage staff to check out a book from the <u>Family Resource Center Library</u> on family engagement.
- Have students interview a family member about their family traditions and customs.
- Encourage students and families to **develop** a family crest to recognize their family's uniqueness.
- Host a Family Fun Night where families and staff continue to foster authentic relationships.
- Host a Family Math learning opportunity for families to support math development at home.

- Host a <u>ParentCamp</u>.
- Post on the school marquee to emphasize your commitment to family and school partnerships.
- Share classroom expectations and student learning goals openly with parents and ask them to do the same.
- **Gather** feedback from families and students on current and potential school workshop topics to identify ways to support social and emotional learning.



- Create a family bulletin board (online or in the building) to highlight school and community events.
- Provide professional learning grounded in a <u>strengths-based approach to family engagement</u>.
- Practice and model two-way inclusive communication with your colleagues and staff at school to engage families.
- End your Morning Meeting or Advisory with an Optimistic Closure focused on continuing the learning with families at home.

- November calendar of ideas to share with families.
- Collaborate with your parent organization (PTA, PTO, Booster) to host a ParentCamp.
- Visit your local library or go online to get a <u>library card</u> for your child.
- Practice digital safety and responsibility with your child. Ideas and tip sheets.

- **Commit** to volunteer at your child's school three times this school year.
- Write letters to school staff for National Family Engagement Day on November 16, 2023.
- **Review** your child's (grades 7 12) Academic Career Plan on <u>Naviance</u> and partner with their school counselor in developing goals.
- Ask your child what they discuss in Morning Meetings and Advisory.
- **Discuss** the FCPS <u>Portrait of a Graduate</u> skills with your child.
