


School Counts at YTD CA Levels

Bull Run Elementary: Chronic Absenteeism







10 to 17 days


CHRONIC ABSENCE

Things to think about...

Missing 2 days a month, or $4 \frac{1}{2}$ days in a marking period, adds up to 18 days a year (10% of the school year) which is considered chronically absent. Many students who are now considered chronically absent may be a result of family trips outside of the scheduled school breaks contributing to the amount of excused and unexcused absences reaching this threshold.



Research has shown that there is a strong correlation between successful school performance and attendance at school. For children as young as kindergarten and first grade age, it is associated with failure to read and do math on grade level in third grade.

How Families Can Help

Communicate with the School by Reporting Future Absences

If parents are aware of a future absence, such as a full day absence for a civic engagement activity (middle or high school) or cultural observance, they may contact the school to report the absence and related date. Extended absences, typically for hardship reasons, must be documented and submitted to the school principal at least three to five school days in advance for review and action.
