The bingo basics:

- Students should write the **title** of each book they read.
- Students must **read** the book listed, independently or with an adult. Books can be at any reading level. Books we read in the library or the classroom can count toward bingo!
- An adult at home and the classroom teacher should sign the finished bingo board.
- Turn the finished bingo paper into the library by **Friday, October 4**.
- Students who get a bingo will get a shout out on the news; students who get a blackout (every box completed) get a prize that varies each month.

A bit of extra information:

- This is **not** required; it is a fun activity for students to explore books and reading!
- **Helpful book lists will be available in the library.**  
These lists are created for all FES students (K-6); students will need to choose individually appropriate books.
- Books do **not** need to be from the library list, or from the Franconia Elementary Library. Books can be from your classroom library, from the public library, from the bookstore, from MyOn... anywhere you can find books!
- Each book can only be used for one box.
