## The bingo basics:

- Students should write the title of each book they read.

- Turn the finished bingo paper into the library by Friday, October 4.
- Students who get a bingo will get a shout out on the news; students who get a blackout (every box competed) get a prize that varies each month.

- Helpful book lists will be available in the library.

  These lists are created for all FES students (K-6); students will need to choose individually appropriate books.

- Each book can only be used for one box.
