CCT Strategy of the Month: Questioning

Active learners are always questioning. Students who take responsibility for asking their own questions become more productive and engaged in their learning processes. Metacognition, or thinking about thinking, involves questioning our individual learning processes. Such questioning helps us solve problems by developing, implementing, and evaluating plans of action. Guiding the development of thinking skills in all students empowers them, increases their independence, and helps them develop to their maximum potential. Children always have a wealth of questions – encourage questioning in your child and work with them to find answers.

Third Graders at Kings Park worked on creating algorithms to draw a monster. Then, they used the same algorithm to see if their monster looks the same!

Kindergarteners tried this out with moving LEGO figures across a board game, while first graders created a hand shake. Second graders created a dance in groups.

Sixth grade students at Kings Glen learned about the solar system during first quarter. In Thinking Lab, they used the Engineering Design Process to brainstorm, design, and build rockets with a team. Student teams determined what planet their rocket will travel to and details about the mission.
