Online Campus Enrollment



Online Campus Enrollment:

Students may enroll in FCPS Online Campus courses with the following requirements:

FCPS Online Campus courses will be “scheduled” into periods 1, 2, 7, or 8 and students must submit a signed Off-Campus Waiver form during Academic Advising. Students will have to arrange their own transportation to or from school.

Should a student have transportation issues, they will be enrolled in a Chantilly HS section if we offer the course. If Chantilly HS does not offer the course, consideration will be given for a study hall period with specific expectations and guidelines around attendance and appropriate technology use.

Academic Advising Timeline

November 12, 2024 - January 10, 2025 - Teacher Presentations & Mini-Conferences

Teachers provide students with information about next year's course options, expected workload in those courses, and any prerequisite skills. Teachers also meet briefly with each student to answer student questions and provide necessary information to aid students with their decision.

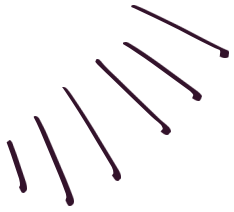

Frequently Asked Questions

Do school counselors change throughout a student's time at CHS?

-We try to maintain the same student-to counselor relationship from 9-12. However, fluctuations in staffing and enrollment sometimes require counselor changes.

How can I learn more about the Academy and student career paths?

-Attend the Academy Open House on January 8 and encourage your child to talk with their school counselor or our College and Career Specialist, Ms. Rodriquez.

What do I need to know about Honors, AP, and DE course?

-Chantilly offers many Honors, AP and DE courses across disciplines that can help students stretch and grow. Honors courses cover curriculum in more depth and move at a faster pace. AP courses are advanced classes that are governed by the College Board and end with an exam that may result in college credits. DE courses are college level courses taught by Chantilly staff in partnerships with NVCC and will result in college credit.

Frequently Asked Questions

Are there any courses recommended or not recommended to take online over the summer?

-We do not recommend that students take courses over the summer due to the compressed timeline and high expectations of credit bearing courses. However, Economics and Personal Finance and HPE 9 and 10 are courses that many students do choose to take to open up their schedules for more elective courses. HPE10 does not include the Driver's Ed portion in the summer. All can be taken Pass/Fail.

How can my student access additional support if they need more time to learn material or repetitions?

-Students can work with teachers during the school day during our Charger Connect Periods on A days, and during after school sessions. We offer late buses on Mondays and Thursdays.
