
Electives





Advanced Academics

- •9th Graders *may* take HONORS and limited AP courses(must meet prereqs)
- •10th-12th graders may take honors, advanced placement or dual enrollment courses(must meet prereqs)
- •NB-Acquiring the highest GPA is not the goal of HS....

Enrollment in Honors/ Advanced Academic Programs

Consider the cumulative effect of multiple honors courses. Prioritize balance and wellness.

It is fine to focus on organization and time management skills as a top priority before taking on more rigor.

Colleges do not consider "weighted" GPA's. They consider unweighted grades, rigor, and the "story" of a HS experience.

Talk with your child about time commitments of sports, clubs, volunteering, religious activities, and family time as well as academics.

We want all students to be appropriately placed and appropriately challenged.

You CAN be admitted to college without taking an honors or AP class.

There are no "EASY" honors courses!



Students who are involved in student activities perform better academically.
