Community Use of Facilities Beyond Instruction

Most of the public meeting places available in the county are FCPS facilities. In many cases, these facilities are provided free of charge to organizations such as homeowners associations, 4H, scouting groups, county employee organizations, and cultural and civic groups. In addition:

- Over 500,000 events occurred in school facilities
- 169 schools and centers are used as polling places for general elections
- 142 schools serve as sites for Fairfax County's School Age Child Care (SACC) program
- 91 religious and cultural organizations used FCPS facilities for regularly scheduled activities





Five-Year Membership Projections SY 2024-25 to SY 2029-30

- Total certified September membership of 180,384 for School Year (SY) 2024-25
- Total membership is projected to begin a decline to 177,778 students
- Births continue the downward trend
- Decline in school-aged population (age groups 5-19) from 2025 to 2030 (Fairfax County Demographic Report)
- Elementary and middle school cohorts are decreasing over time
- Largest cohorts are in 11th and 12th grade
- Residential developments under construction are incorporated into the five-year projections
- Housing growth is primarily multifamily housing units
- Projections are updated annually in the CIP





Capital Improvement Program (CIP)

- A planning and fiscal management tool used to coordinate the location, timing, and funding of capital projects over five years
- Annual review of current student membership and facilities data to identify:
 - New construction and/or repurposing, capacity enhancements, renovations (based on the renovation queue), and site acquisitions
- Newly identified needs are included in the estimated schedule of capital projects for the next five years
- Facilities performs other projects beyond those established in the CIP, such as major maintenance and infrastructure work







Capital Construction Project Schedule Summary

The CIP Cash Flow identifies funding for capital projects for the next five years. The ten-year schedule illustrates the phasing and timeline.

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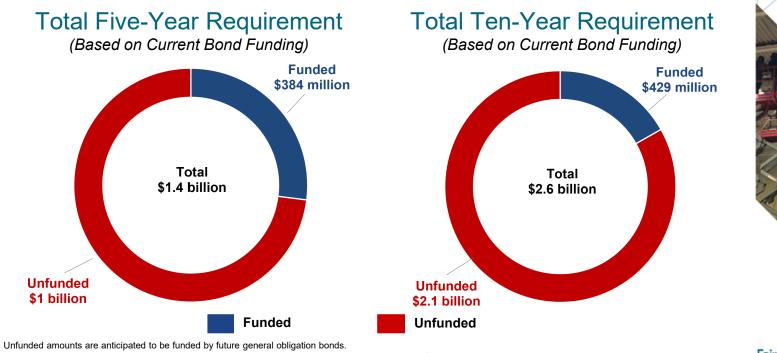


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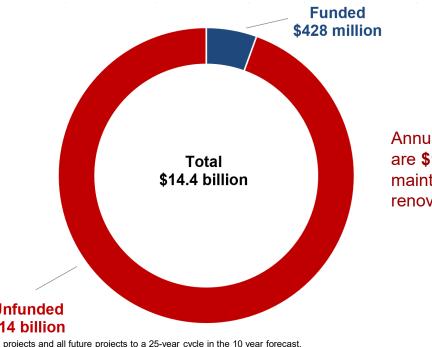
Capital Improvement Program Funding Summary



Five-year and ten-year requirements assume funding and schedule based on anticipated bond cap of \$230 million annually.



Funding Needs for a 25-year Renovation Cycle



Annual funding needs are \$1.4 billion to maintain a 25-year renovation cycle.

Unfunded \$14 billion

Estimate assumes bringing current projects and all future projects to a 25-year cycle in the 10 year forecast. Uses current CIP estimates; not adjusted for escalation. Funded amounts are school General Obligation Bond referendums that have been approved by voters.

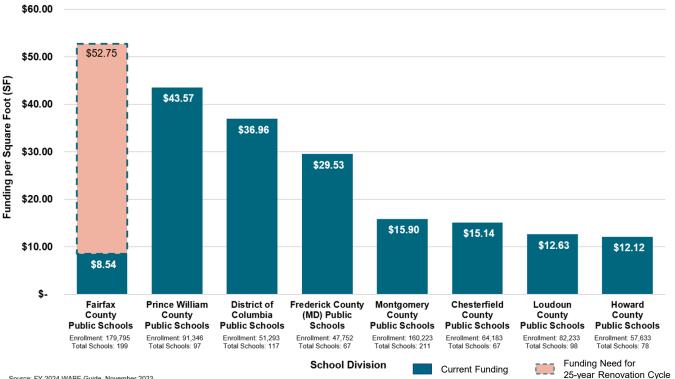


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Capital Funding Comparison (Per Square Feet)

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Current Construction Costs

- Project estimates are routinely updated, and reflect the impacts the market conditions realized in recent years:
 - Inflation
 - Supply Chain
 - Prevailing Wage
- Construction awards on recent projects
 - The last three capital bond solicitations have resulted in contract awards with an average value 12% below project estimates
 - Value-engineering at the time of bid has not been required on these projects







Current Funding Impacts

- Projects still remain more costly than in recent years; however, updated estimates allow for a more realistic planning of the capital pipeline. This does not address the number of projects that can be undertaken in a given bond cycle
- The current annual bond of \$230M is not sufficient to comply with Policy 8258 to maintain a 20-25 year renovation cycle
- Negative impacts to the facilities program

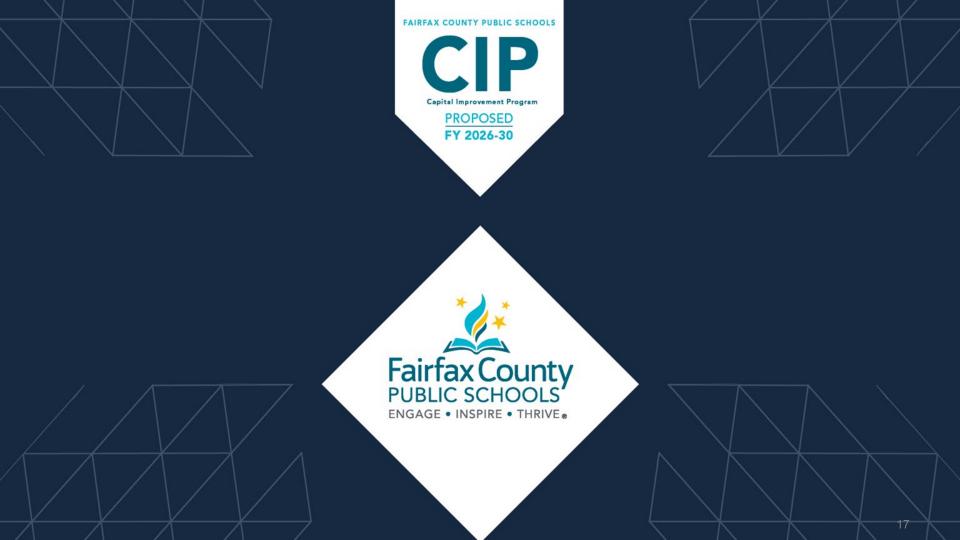

Proposed Capital Improvement Program FY 2026-30



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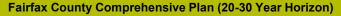

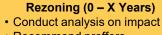

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Capital Projects

- **New school construction:** Considered when significant capacity deficits are likely to persist over time or program need
- **Repurposing:** Aimed at reusing the existing inventory of school sites not currently being used as schools to satisfy division needs
- **Capacity enhancements:** Permanent methods for accommodating future needs; completed for both program changes and in response to growth
- Facility Renovations: Aimed at ensuring that all schools provide the facilities necessary; based on a Renovation Queue
- Site Acquisition: Included in the cash flow

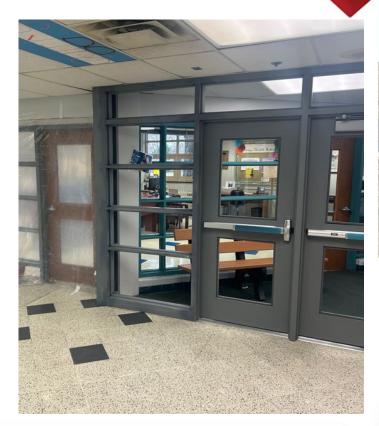

Net Zero Energy

- Active design and construction projects maximize NZE-ready where possible to prepare for future installations (i.e., structural loading of roof to allow future solar).
- Future projects starting in FY26 and beyond include CIP funding for major energy reduction measures to gain a possible on-site net zero ready energy such as Photovoltaic (solar) arrays and ground source heat (geothermal). Staff to advise if not feasible once in design.

• Beginning in 2025, a referendum for General Obligation Bond funding is planned to be on the ballot for Fairfax County voters for schools every other year for \$460 million • Does not include routine maintenance; current maintenance backlog has significant impacts of facilities projects

• Proffer amounts allocated to projects vary annually

• Capital Sinking funds are not guaranteed

• The Fairfax County Park Authority allocates an annual budget for replacing artificial turf practice fields, which may vary each year. In FY 2024, Park Authority allocated \$2.38 million to replace four practice fields.







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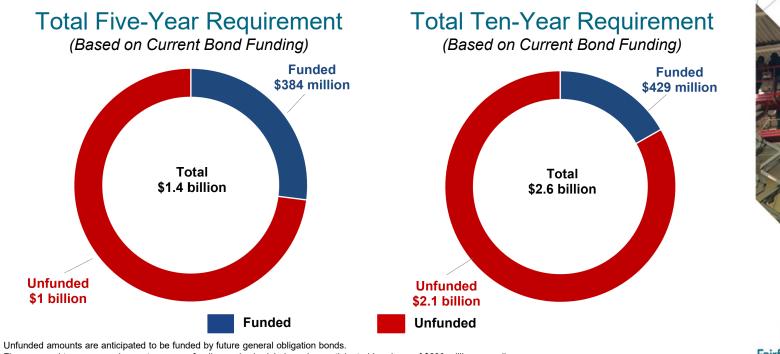

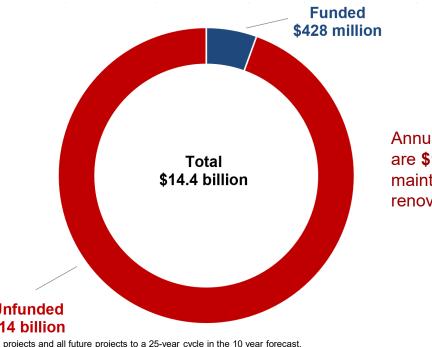


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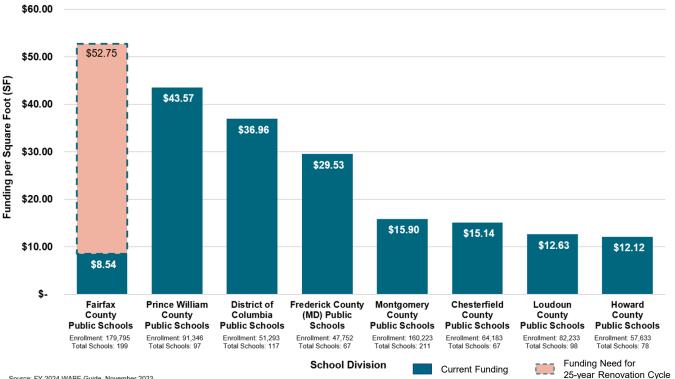
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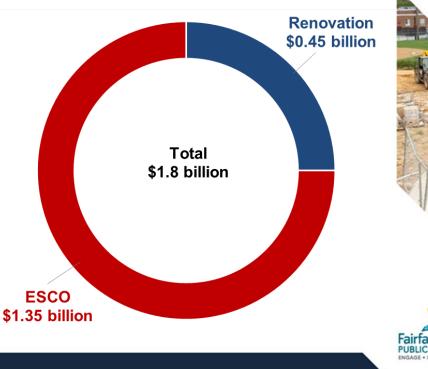




JET Recommendation #2 Goal of 50% Energy Use Reduction by 2040

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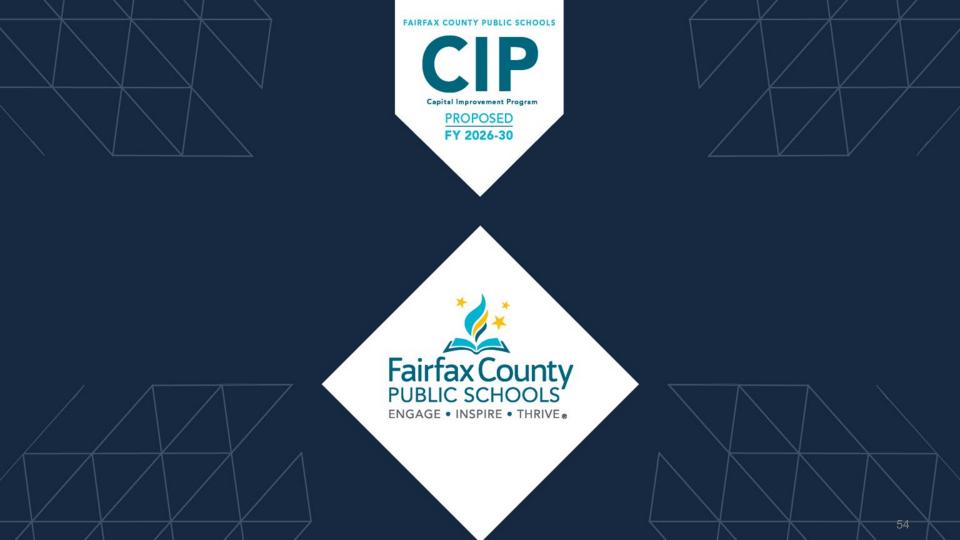


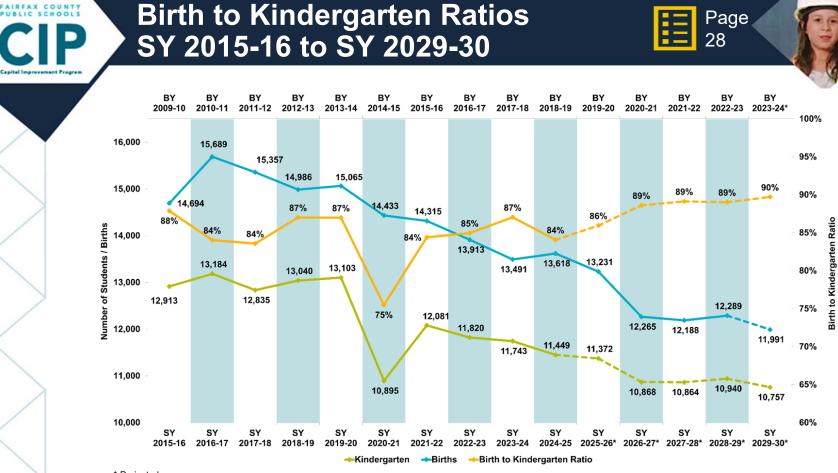

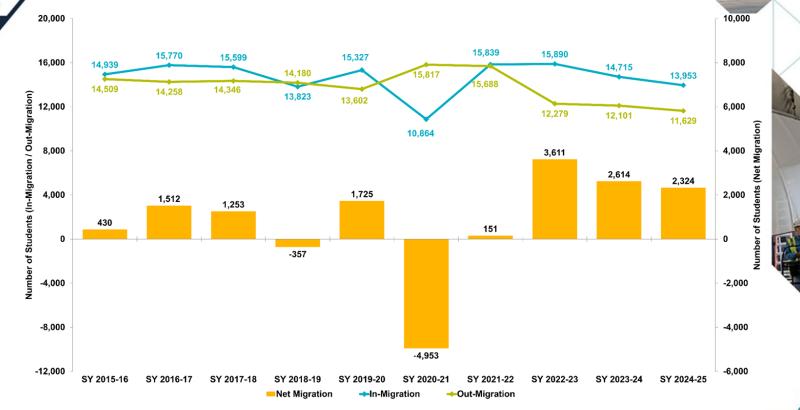
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Net Migration SY 2015-16 to SY 2024-25

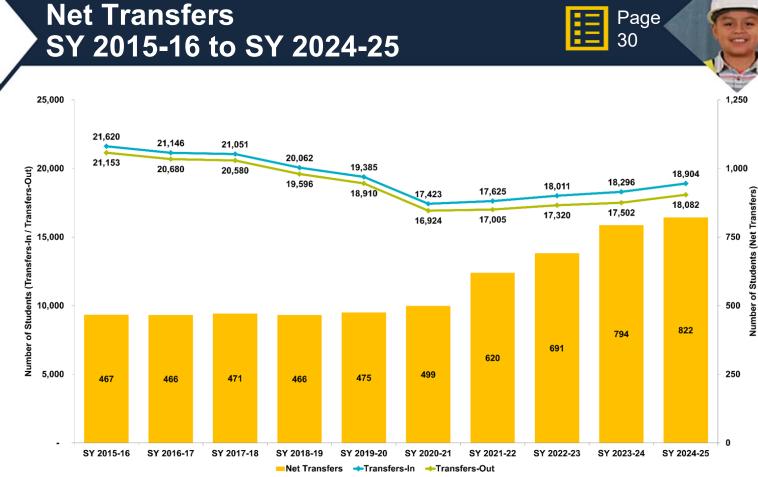
