Key Concepts:

- Folktales are traditional stories that often teach a lesson and are part of many cultures.
- Every story is narrated from a unique point of view and that point of view shapes the story.
- We can learn valuable lessons about understanding others, working together, and problem-solving through stories

Student Literacy Progress:

In this Unit, your child completed the following assessments.

- **Weekly Cumulative Phonics Assessments:** *This assessment measures how they are progressing with learning the phonics skills taught and/or reviewed so far this year. These assessments are sent home in your child's weekly folder*

The assessments results above provide teachers with a snapshot of how students are progressing in grade level expectations and are one of many data points that will be considered when assigning progress report scores. They inform teachers of areas where students need additional instruction and practice, so they can continue to work towards mastering grade level standards. You can expect performance on the assessments to increase over time as the students continue to learn and practice their grade level skills.

In addition to these formal assessments, your child also worked to build knowledge on the unit topic, apply strategies while reading and listening to texts, and demonstrate comprehension through speaking and writing. Please review your child's unit magazine that will also show you how they are progressing in Language Arts.
