## Job Description: Community Health Worker: Greene County

Status/time: Full-time (40 hrs/wk), temporary, contract position through May 2026

**Position summary**: The Community Health Worker (CHW) position is a full-time, temporary contract position funded for two years in the Blue Ridge Health District (BRHD). The District includes Albemarle, Charlottesville, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, and Nelson. This position will be primarily based in Greene County but will work alongside the BRHD CHW Team to serve the entire District. The CHW will conduct community outreach and education around health department services like COVID-19 vaccines, car seat safety, and other health topics and be a liaison for other community resources, like food, housing, etc.

## Duties and responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Conduct door-to-door outreach and engage residents in locality neighborhoods
- Provide education on COVID-19 prevention, testing, vaccination, and support services
- Maintain a log of activities and complete regular reports in order to meet grant objectives
- Attend community events to provide outreach and support
- Refer community members to services and resources based on their identified needs
- Educate and provide information on different health topics to empower community members with the skills and knowledge to live healthy lives
- Build and maintain relationships with community members and organizational partners
- May assist with translations for literature and communications
- Other responsibilities and duties as assigned
