**simple test** to allow for  
**early treatment**

3 in 4

say having **treatments** that  
slow progression makes **early  
diagnosis** more important

9 in 10

would want a **medication that could  
slow the progression** of Alzheimer's  
disease following a diagnosis

3 in 5

would accept **moderate or  
high levels of risk** to take medication  
that slows the progression of  
Alzheimer's disease
