



Parent Institute for Engagement (PIE): Leadership and Lifelong Learning

PIE is a **12-month training program for parents/caregivers with children who have received early intervention services through the Early Support for Infants and Toddlers program (ESIT)** and primarily for those who are not working in the early intervention field. One spot is designated for a parent/caregiver who has worked in the early intervention field for less than 18 months. Our goal is to have a **racially and geographically diverse group of participants**.

PARTICIPANTS WILL LEARN ABOUT:

- Robert’s Rules of Order *(a framework commonly used in public meetings)*
- The State Interagency Coordinating Council and its role in advising and assisting ESIT
- The early intervention system and Part C of IDEA
- Leadership and advocacy
- Public speaking and presentations

Participants will develop skills to be great candidates for school boards, and government bodies.

This is a wonderful practice ground for leadership opportunities.
