

Apple Health Core Connections (AHCC) is an original program delivering health care services for Washington's children and youth in foster care, adoption support, young adult alumni of foster care (up to age 26), and children reunified with their parents. Children and youth entering foster care are automatically enrolled in AHCC. American Indian/Alaska Native children may choose to opt in at any time.

AHCC's primary goal is to make health care easier. Our healthcare coordinators work with caregivers, caseworkers, bio parents, adoptive parents and the youth we serve to ensure AHCC members get the care they need. This includes access to primary care, behavioral health, vision, dental, specialists, durable medical equipment (DME), Home Health and more.
