Keeping current with training requirements

For Community Residential Providers impacted by training requirements outlined in [Chapter 74.39A RCW](#)

- Supported Living
- Group Homes
- Group Training Homes
- Children’s Licensed Staff Residential
- Alternative Living
- Companion Homes
- State Operated Community Residential (SOCR)

Rules for the training requirements are contained in [Chapter 388-829 WAC](#) and additional standards for the adult residential programs are located in [Chapter 388-101D WAC](#).

COVID-19/Pandemic Response Updates

Emergency rules in place for training and Continuing Education

The primary changes in this emergency rule filing include:

- Adding “specialty training” to WAC 388-829-0086
- New timelines for completing training and specialty training in the table in WAC 388-829-0086
- New timelines for completing CE in WAC 388-829-0087

1. Under WAC 388-829-0086, a direct support professional employed during the COVID-19 public health emergency must complete training, including specialty training, as follows:

Worker hired during the time frame of:	Must complete 75-hour new employee training no later than:
8/17/2019 to 9/30/2020	10/31/2022
10/1/2020 to 4/30/2021	1/31/2023
5/1/2021 to 3/31/2022	4/30/2023
4/1/2022 to 9/30/2022	8/31/2023
10/1/2022 to 12/31/2022 or the end of the COVID-19 training waivers established by gubernatorial proclamation, whichever is later	9/30/2023 or no more than 120 days after the end of the COVID-19 training waivers established by gubernatorial proclamation, whichever is later
After the end of the COVID-19 training waivers established by gubernatorial proclamation or beginning 1/1/2023, whichever is later	As required under WAC 388-829-0015

2. Under WAC 388-829-0087(5), all direct support professionals employed between March 1, 2020, and Feb. 28, 2021, are granted 12 hours of DSHS-approved continuing education credit for the training entitled "COVID-19 On-The-Job Training Protocols," bearing the DSHS approval code CE2135218. No physical certificate for this training will be issued or required.

3. Under WAC 388-829-0086(6), all direct support professionals have until Dec. 31, 2022, or 120 days from the end of the COVID-19 training waivers established by gubernatorial proclamation, whichever is later, to complete any additional CE that may have become due while training waivers were in place in excess of the 12 hours of CE granted.

Fatal Five E-learning Trainings (developed by IntellectAbility Inc.)

- DDA purchased one license for all providers to access IntellectAbility's Fatal Five E-learning course. This course identifies and trains direct support professionals to recognize and respond to the fatal five conditions considered preventable causes of death in people with IDD. These online courses are part of our comprehensive spectrum of developmental disabilities training resources and include targeted

training for staff working with developmentally disabled adults and children.

- These courses are housed in IntellectAbility's Learning Management System and they are offering provider organizations access to this system to enroll their staff, track their progress and print certificates.
