This 34-hour course, Crisis Awareness and Communication in Peer Support, is designed for licensed and credentialed peer support workers who wish to increase their skills in working with individuals experiencing crisis. It is understood that to take this training you are already working (or have worked) in peer support and are seeking to add new skills to your toolbox. Therefore, the basic skills of peer support will not be covered in detail in this course, except for a quick review of a few concepts. We seek to expand on the knowledge you have gained through your Certified Peer Counselor training and your work in the field as a peer.
