Strategy SE4B: VETS ENGAGED

Purpose: This program seeks to fund an entity or entities to convene community-building events and networks that increase social connection for veterans and military servicemembers and their respective families in King County. The strategy seeks to provide community-building networks through social engagement opportunities for veterans living in King County with the intention of reducing isolation while helping bridge the military-civilian divide. As with seniors, social isolation is increasingly understood as a predictor of reduced quality and quantity of life for veterans. **(All awards are for \$9,999 from the Veterans third of the VSHSL.)**

Projects for a Civil Society will conduct experiential 20-hour workshops, with 20 justice-system involved veteran participants, and three or four facilitators in each workshop. The workshops are intended to counteract veterans' sense of isolation, alienation, depression, anger, shame, and distrust caused by PTSD and moral injury, creating in their place a strong sense of connection to community, trust, self-esteem, empathy, and communication skills. Vets Engaged funding helps the program expand from Pierce County into King County.

The strategy seeks to provide connections to services for seniors (55+) living in King County to promote positive health outcomes in a more sustainable system that emphasizes prevention of crises.

Sound Generations will build and provide a home-visiting team of behavioral health and human services intervention experts who will be providing comprehensive behavioral health and cognitive assessment, evaluation, intervention and connections for seniors 55 and older living in King County to services and resources, with an emphasis on populations likely to struggle with access to traditional healthcare avenues.
