

Ornament Project for the Governor's Mansion

What:

The governor's mansion has once again requested ornaments made by students from around the state to decorate the mansion's holiday tree. The mansion receives a high number of visitors during the holiday season and they greatly enjoy involving K-12 students from our state in decorating the tree.

When:

Ornaments need to arrive at OSPI by November 13, 2019.

Who:

Students whose teachers would like them to participate and make ornaments that would be displayed at the Governor's Mansion.

Details:

Theme: A theme of "**State Symbols**" has been requested.

Size: Approximately between 3 ½" and 4 ½" or about the size of a 3x5 index card (can be two or three dimensional). Also, be sure the ornaments are not too heavy as they will hang from a freshly cut tree branch.

Number needed: Approximately 400 total are needed and this goal can be met with sixteen (16) selected classrooms contributing a class set of approximately twenty-five (25) ornaments (one per student).

Recognition: All students will receive a certificate of appreciation/participation.

Release form: A release form will be provided by OSPI. Ornaments will not be returned, however, they will become part of the state archived permanent collection.
