Native Knowledge 360° (NK360°) is the National Museum of the American Indian's (NMAI) national education initiative to transform teaching and learning about Native Americans.

The NMAI is hiring two (2) experienced curriculum writers who want to be part of the dynamic education work taking place in the [NK360°](#) project. The writers will be part of a team responsible for researching, developing, writing, and producing online lessons and other resources for K–12 teachers and students. Materials include multimedia online lessons with interactive components, storyboards for videos and narrated slide shows, student activities using primary resources, interpretive and instructional text, and lesson plans for teachers. The NMAI is looking for candidates who can manage and work effectively with a team that may include Native consultants, educational scholars, teachers, content specialists, editors, and the NMAI media and web staff. Teamwork, good communication and collaboration skills, and the ability to meet deadlines are a must!

Additional desired experience includes evaluation and testing, and development and delivery of in-person and virtual teacher training.

A minimum of an undergraduate degree in education (master's degree preferred) is required along with significant experience working with and/or teaching about Native American topics and communities. The positions will be for a term of two (2) years, with the possibility of extension, and come with benefits. The NMAI will consider allowing remote work outside the Washington, DC region for candidates who can document successful experiences and abilities to work responsibly and independently. Remote workers will need to travel to DC quarterly. Additional project travel will be required.

- English language arts education/curriculum development specialists
- Native American educators

To apply, please submit a cover letter and resume with references. Interviews and work samples will be requested from selected applicants. Applications will be accepted through **May 21, 2021**.
