The Washington State Indian Education Association (WSIEA) takes an opportunity each year during our annual conference to acknowledge accomplishments of Native individuals who have contributed significantly to the education of Native people and of excellent Native Students. These awards include:

Indian Educator of the Year Indian Elder of the Year Indian Parent of the Year Higher Education Indian Student of the Year High School Indian Student of the Year

WSIEA honors one high school senior and one higher education student who will receive a monetary merit award (\$800 for high school seniors and \$1,000 for current college students). Award recipients will be announced at the WSIEA Awards Banquet taking place Tuesday evening, April 5, at the 37th Annual WSIEA Conference. Nominations only need to be made for the Indian Educator of the Year, Elder of the Year, and Outstanding Indian Parent of the Year. Applications/ nominations must be postmarked on or before Friday, February 25, 2022.

Indian Arts & Craft Act of 1990. The Indian Arts and Crafts Act of 1990 makes it illegal to market an art of craft item using the name of a tribe if a member of that tribe did not actually create it. For a first time violation of the Act an individual can face civil or criminal penalties up to \$250,000 fine or a 5-year prison term, or both. If a business in violation, it can face a fine up to \$1,000,000. n violation, it can face a fine up to \$1,000,000.
