The Foundation for Teaching Economics (FTE) is pleased to offer this professional development program for current and preservice teachers. The program goal is to provide educators with lesson plans of activities, economics content instruction, and a networking opportunity. What's unique are the FTE simulations: instructors run the activities with real students so the participants can observe the students' interactions. The teachers see, up close, why FTE-designed lessons are so effective and leave the program with a better knowledge of economics, new classroom strategies, and a renewed enthusiasm for teaching.

Program participants meet and stay on the University of Washington campus. The program begins at 4:00 pm on July 11th and ends at 5:00pm July 16th.

Program details:

- \$500 professional development grants available to teachers and preservice teachers
- \$150 commuter stipend for participants not staying in FTE provided lodging.
- Lodging, materials, and most meals provided by the FTE
- Three semester hours of graduate credit in economics available
- Attendance is open to current and preservice teachers of economics, history, and civics
