WIDA Screening Reminders



- All test administrators must recertify for test administration annually.
- WIDA Secure Portal training resets on September 1 (today). Screener training courses will now display dates of all successful attempts at the training quizzes.
- K students screen only on listening & speaking before Jan. 1st
- TK students should be provisionally qualified based on home language survey and screened after May 1st ([TK Provisional Status Coding](#))
- WIDA ACCESS scores from out-of-state may be accepted (not Screener scores)

How to determine if an in-state transfer student needs to be screened?

- Look up the student in the LEP Application to determine whether the student has already been identified as a multilingual/English learner in Washington.

1. Look up the student in the LEP Application.
2. Locate the Enroll/Withdraw Data
3. Find the Exit/WD Code for the 2021-2022 School Year
4. Code "A" = Transition met Transition/Proficient level on annual ELP Assessment

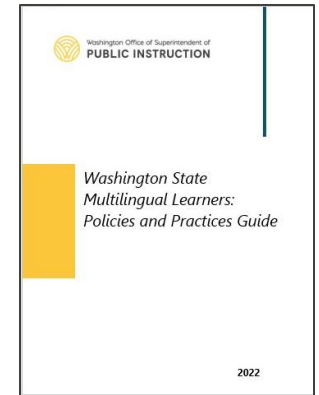

Family Notification Letters

- Must be sent within first 30 calendar days
- Use [Family Notification Data](#) for 4 and 5-year graduation rates & average years in program
- May want to separate K from grades 1-12
- Include programs offered in district

Family Notification of New Student Placement in an English Language Development Program

Dear Parent or Guardian,

When you registered your child for school, the home language survey you completed indicated your child first spoke a language other than English OR your child uses a language other than English most often at home. Based on this information, the law requires the school to give your child an English Language Proficiency Screener to determine your child's eligibility for English language development instruction to help your child acquire English.

Based on this screener, your child is eligible for English Language Development services for the *INSERT YEAR* school year. Your child will receive services until they reach proficiency on the state-approved English language proficiency assessment.
