Option 1: <u>Reflecting on our Practice: Ten Ways Schools Can Foster Belonging</u>
<u>Among Students With and Without Disabilities</u> by Erik Carter, Vanderbilt

Check out this short handout from the Progress Center at the American Institutes for Research. Look at the ten dimensions of belonging – how do you feel about these categories? Do you see these in the systems work you do?
