Graduation Equity Webinar on Restorative Practices When: October 11 |10–11:30 am PDT

Restorative practices offer opportunities for transformational positive school climate and alternatives to traditional disciplinary action. Individuals within a community are most capable of sustaining change when they feel engaged and can develop a sense of belonging. Restorative practices which focus on resolving conflict, repairing harm, and healing relationships through a foundation of integrated and preventative social emotional strategies, have been shown to prevent bullying and reduce disciplinary incidents in school. The webinar is presented by Briana Kelly, the OSPI Assistant Director of Restorative Practices and Student Discipline, and features Dr. Lori Lynass, the Executive Director of Sound Supports, who will share advice with school staff about implementing restorative practices. She will be joined by our practitioner panel from the Franklin Pierce School District to talk about their experiences as restorative justice facilitators.
