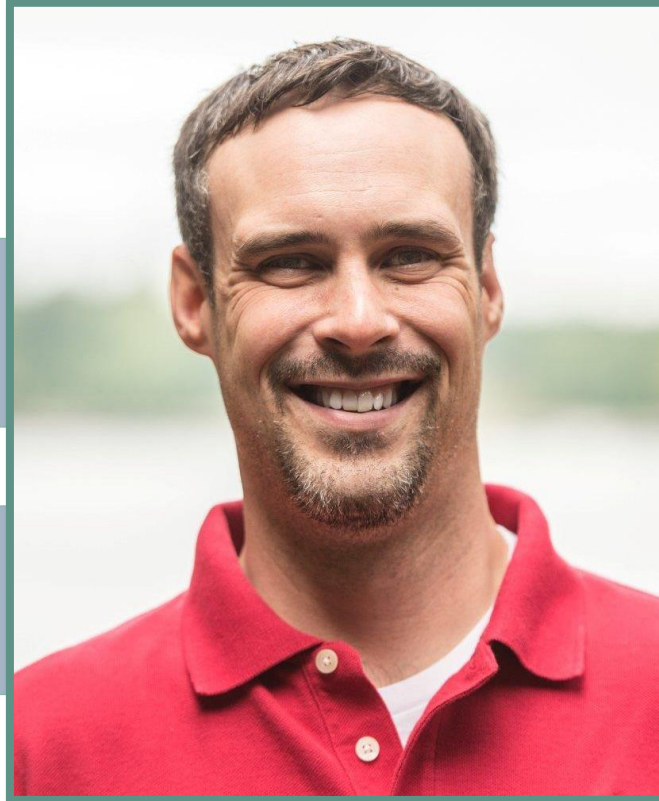

Barrier Reduction Decision Package

- Reduce student barriers to participating in Open Doors
- Includes expenses related to transportation, equipment, meals, and more.
- Requesting 1.9M in funding
- Requires **legislative** approval

Barrier Reduction Decision Package

- This is a **supplemental budget** year
- Short session, 60 days
 - Modifications, adjustments, & build-on to existing works
- Decision-packages are how OSPI *requests adjustments* for approval by the legislature.

High School Diploma

Reminders

To graduate, students must complete:

- 1) a High School and Beyond Plan,
- 2) the credit and subject area requirements,
- 3) a graduation pathway option, and
- 4) any other local (district) requirements.

***Note:** Washington state requires 24 credits and items 1-3 for high school diploma



Age Requirements

To be eligible for Open Doors Youth Reengagement, students must:

- 1) be age 16 on or before September 1 of the school year
- 2) not be age 21 on or before September 1 of the school year

Age requirements **cannot** be waived or changed.



Reminders



10% of Students on Waiver

Only approximately 10% of student enrollments should enter the program on a waiver/referral.

- Recommended but not in rules (WAC) or law (RCW).
- Waiver/referral percentage is an item we use for review and renewal.

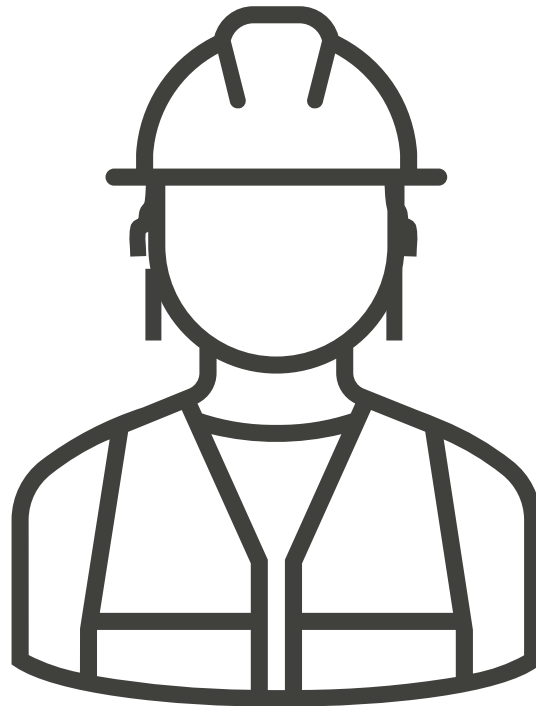

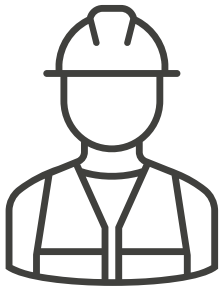


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New! Elective Credit for Paid Work Experience

WHAT



High schools offering students the opportunity to learn the [Washington State High School Financial Education Learning Standards](#) are authorized to adopt board policy that will allow students aged 16+ to earn **up to 2 elective credits** for paid work experience.

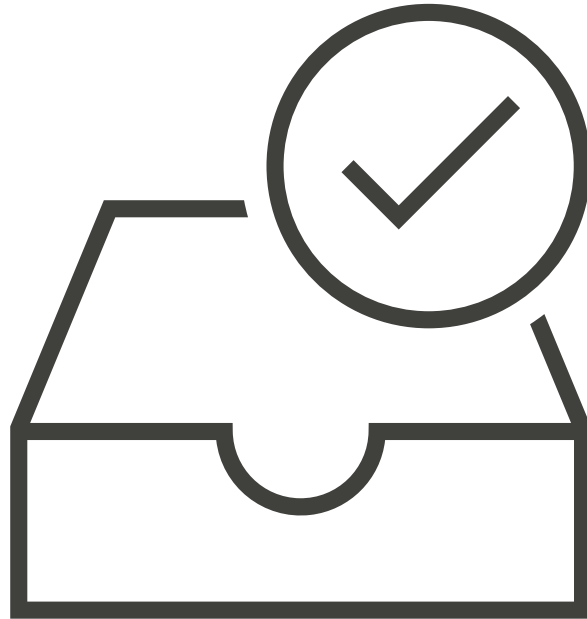

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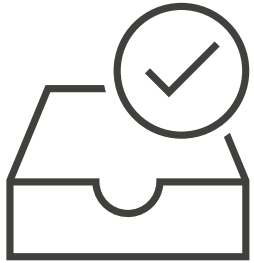


CTE Credit in Open Doors



CTE Credit in Open Doors

WHAT



CTE credit **is** available in district-based Open Doors programs.

Requirements:

- Taught by a CTE-certificated teacher with career-area endorsement
- Course is district-approved and part of the district's CTE packet sent to OSPI for approval.
- Not available for vocational funding – must be backed out in EDS.

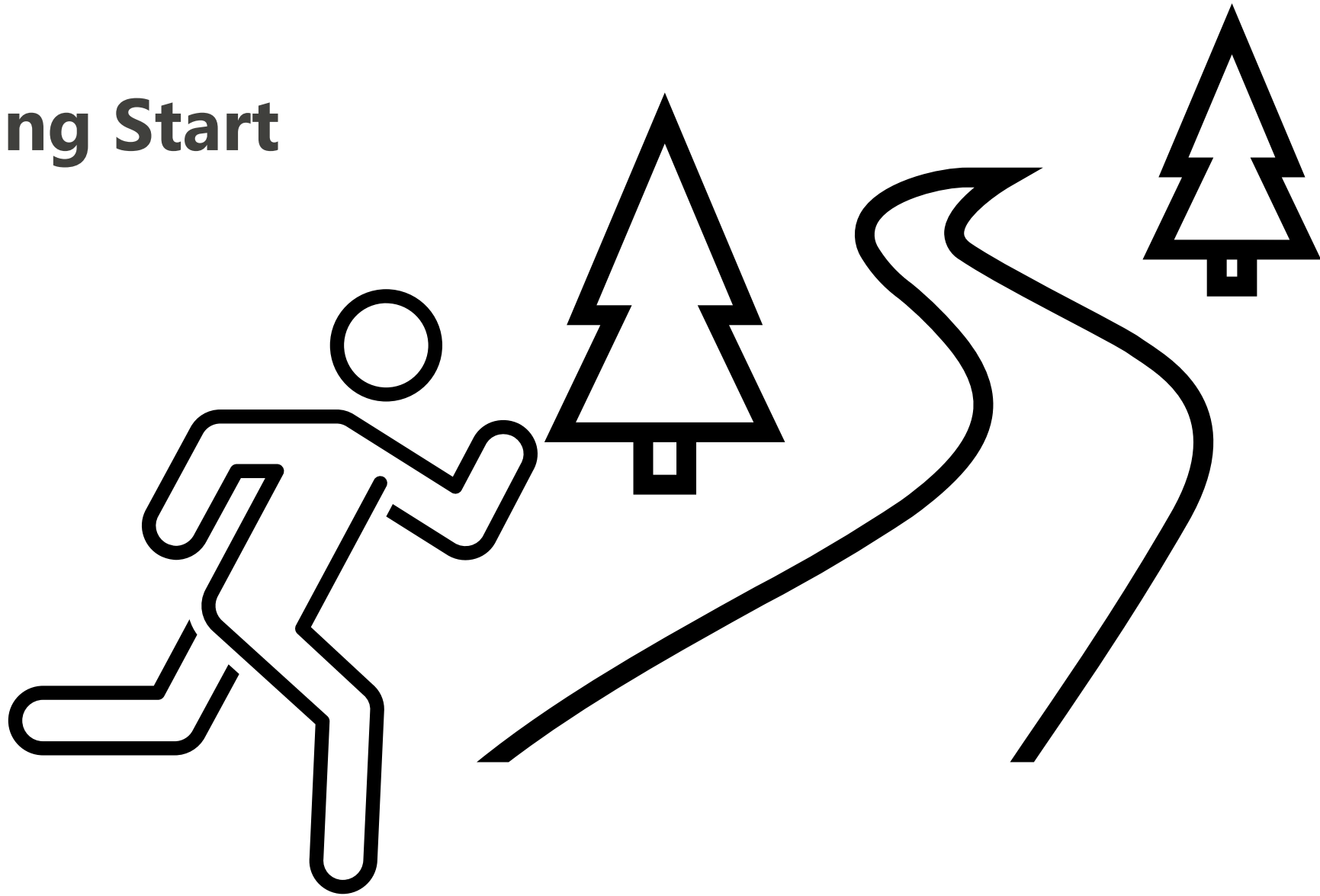

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Running Start



Running Start Dual Credit Updates

WHAT



- Increases combined maximum AAFTE from 1.20 to 1.40
- Opens summer quarter for a max of 10 credits (incl. "rising juniors")
- Requires districts to give RS access for ALL eligible students
- Emphasizes access for home, private, STEC, and charter school students
- Expands eligibility for fee waivers at colleges

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Running Start: After-Exit & Summer Quarter

WHAT



- \$3M for summer Running Start proviso
- Graduating seniors only. Students must stay enrolled through summer
- Met maximum Running Start enrollment limits
- 15 credits from AA degree
- Enrolled at CTCs only to complete classes for AA

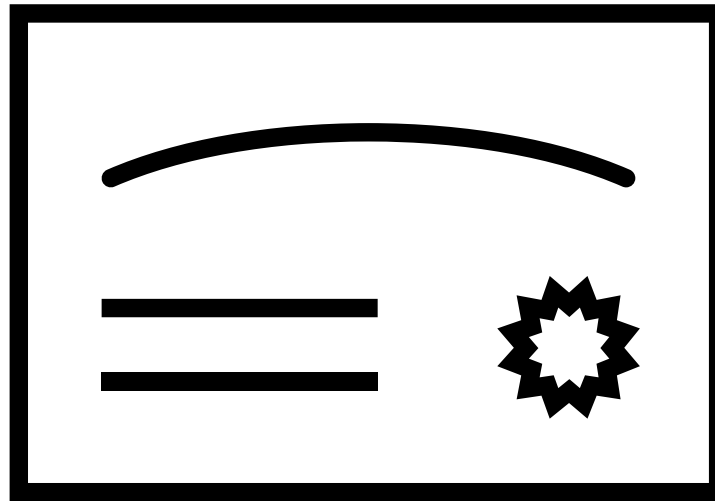

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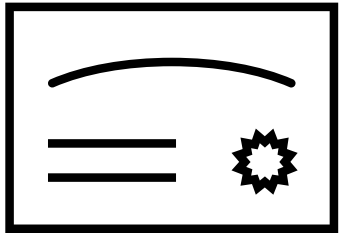


Credit Requirements for Graduation



Credit Requirements for Graduation

WHAT



Washington state **requires 24 credits for a diploma.** Certain credits must be completed in specific content areas. Up to two (2) credits can be waived locally based on a student's unusual circumstances.

Students must meet their local district requirements to be eligible to graduate. This may include additional credits.

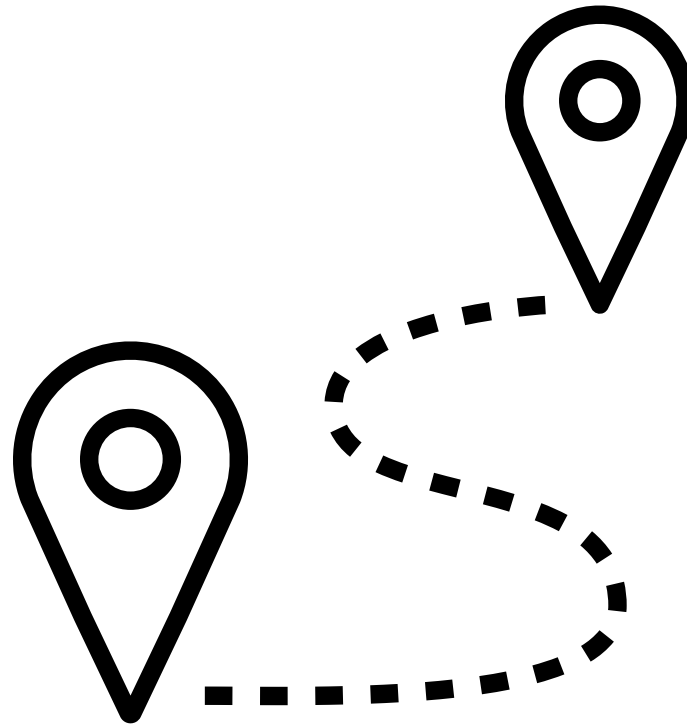

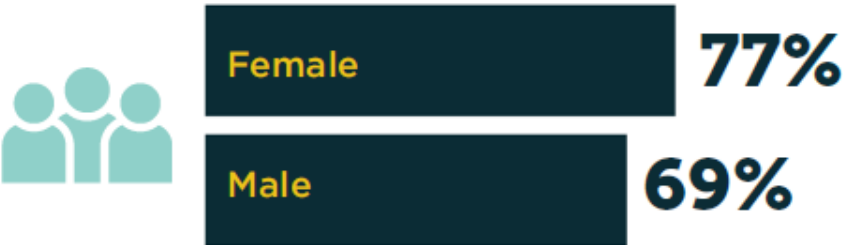


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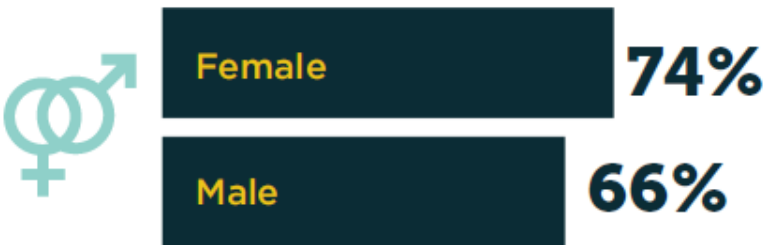

Much like their connected peers (who are in school and/or working), **most opportunity youth are sexually active.**

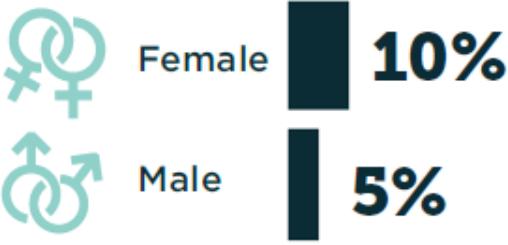
Were sexually active in the past year

Fourteen percent (14%) of opportunity youth identify as **lesbian, gay, bisexual, or “something else”** (LGBQ) compared to ten percent (10%) of their peers who are in school or working.



Comprehensive Sexual Health Education Reporting Requirements

WHAT



Washington public schools must provide comprehensive, medically accurate sexual health education to all students at least **twice** (2x) between **grades 9–12**.

By September 1st of each year, all public schools must identify to OSPI any curricula used to provide comprehensive sexual health education.

WHAT



School districts must allow American Indian and Alaskan Native K–12 and higher education students who are members of federally recognized tribes to wear tribal regalia and objects of cultural significance at graduation ceremonies and related events. Policies are to be updated accordingly at the district and college levels.

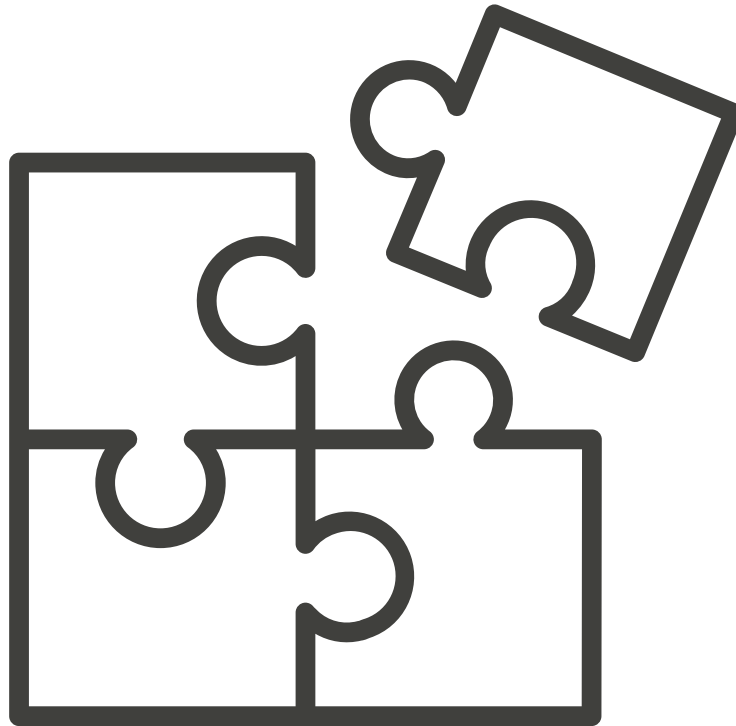

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Credit consolidation for highly mobile students and others

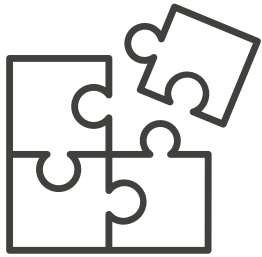


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Credit consolidation for highly mobile students and others

WHAT



When a student is identified as a highly mobile student, including state dependent (foster care), post-resident (formerly in detention), CHINS, homeless, or At-risk, **partial credits must be consolidated** and granted.

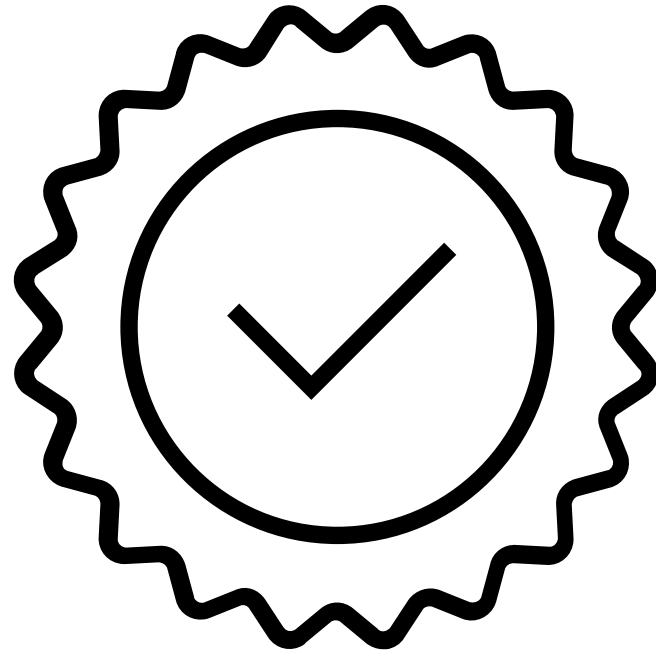

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GED and Language credits for students formerly in institutional education

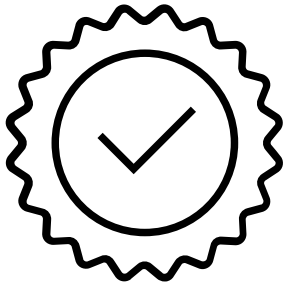


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GED and Language credits for students formerly in institutional ed

WHAT



All students in or **released from** an institutional education facility (i.e., Post-Resident Youth) who have passed any portion of the GED or a language assessment shall be granted at **least one (1) credit** on their high school transcript in the subject area. This pertains to awarding credit in world languages, American sign language, and GED subjects.
