"I knew that if I guit, I would be failing not only my tribe and my family, but most of all myself."

Culture, Identity, and Purpose

Caleb draws strength from his lineage and his grandfather's resilience:

"My grandfather never let disadvantages take down his spirit. Knowing I have that bloodline to uphold gave me the strength to keep trying my best."

"I hope to live up to my strong lineage as a Haida and be a role model to Native youth—to show we can accomplish great things, regardless of our circumstances."

Looking Ahead

Caleb plans to attend University of Washington Tacoma to study Business Administration and Marketing while earning his real estate license. His dream is to start a corporation focused on affordable housing and collaborate with tribes to build homes and opportunities for Native communities.

"I hope to create affordable living through apartment complexes and homes. I want to collaborate with Native tribes and communities to build on their land to support people struggling."



Beyond real estate, Caleb hopes to continue inspiring others through public speaking and mentorship:

"With a world full of constant negativity, I think speaking positivity can give people hope and a better sense of mind."
