Leading for Inclusion: A Transformation Convening

May 12 & August 11 | Renton, WA

This two-day convening, hosted by member organizations in the Inclusionary Practices Technical Assistance Network (IPTN), brings district and building leaders together to collaborate and reimagine their systems to end exclusionary practices for students eligible for special education services. State data show the students most frequently marginalized in Washington schools are Black students with disabilities and students with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Participants will confront exclusionary patterns, redesign inherited systems, and leave with concrete strategies and a clear action plan to build inclusion into the structure of their schools.
