Dear Wisconsin Children's Safety Advocates:

In February 2017, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission issued a total of **8 recalls relating to products affecting children**. Attached is a summary of the releases identifying the product, the problem, and what should be done with the recalled product.

We have found that not all of the recalls are picked up by the news media as they occur. This monthly summary will give you the opportunity to review all of the children's product safety recalls for the past month. If you are interested in a complete text of the recall, double click on the hyperlink at the end of the recall description. This will direct you to the recall notice located on the CPSC website.



KEEP YOUR KIDS SAFE

Release Number: (#17-081) Disney Destinations, LLC, d/b/a Disney Theme Park Merchandise, of Lake Buena Vista, F.L., is announcing the voluntary recall of about 3,000 Mickey Mouse nightlights due to fire hazard. The date code FAC # 019808-16150 is printed on the bottom rear of the nightlight. The UPC code, 400009489637, is printed on a sticker on the bottom of the product packaging.

Problem: The liquid from the nightlight can leak onto the electrical outlet, posing a fire hazard.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled nightlights and contact Walt Disney Parks and Resorts US, Inc. for instructions on returning them for a full refund. You can contact Walt Disney Parks and Resorts US, Inc. toll-free at 844-722-1444 from 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. ET Monday through Friday, or online at www.disneyarks.com and click on "Safety Recall" at the bottom of the page for more information.

Release Number: (#17-084) Feld Entertainment, announces the voluntary recall of about 30,100 light-spinner wands which either have Mickey Mouse or Minnie Mouse at the top. The Mickey Mouse wands are yellow, red and black. The Minnie Mouse wands are pink, white and blue. The wands measure about 18 inches tall.

Problem: The top component can detach and expose an eight inch metal rod, posing an injury hazard to young children.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled wands and contact Feld Entertainment to receive a full refund. Release Number: (#17-085) Restoration Hardware Inc., of Corte Madera, Calif., announces the voluntary recall of about 2,700 metal top dining tables. This recall involves Restoration Hardware's Railroad Tie & Parsons Railroad Tie dining tables. The recalled tables are round or rectangular with thin sheets of zinc/dark gray color metal on the table tops. The item number is printed on a white sticker underneath the tabletop.

Problem: The table's metal top can contain lead and presents a risk of lead exposure to children. Lead is toxic if ingested and can cause adverse health effects.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled tables, cover the tables and place the table out of the reach of children and contact Restoration Hardware to receive a free replacement table or a full refund. Release Number: (#17-088) Britax Child Safety Inc., of Fort Mill, S.C., announces the voluntary recall of about 676,000 Britax B-Agile and BOB Motion Strollers with Click & Go receivers. This recall involves Britax B-Agile and BOB Motion strollers (when used as a travel system with a car seat carrier attached). All models are folding, single or double occupant strollers and have Click & Go receiver mounts that attach the car seat carrier to the stroller frame.

Problem: A damaged receiver mount on the stroller can cause the car seat to disengage and fall un-expectedly, posing a fall hazard to infants in the car seat.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using their Click & Go receiver mounts and contact Britax for a free repair kit for single strollers. Owners of the recalled double strollers should stop using them with car seats attached. Consumers can continue to use their stroller or car seat independently without the car seat attached to the stroller. Release Number: (#17-093) Moose Toys Proprietary Ltd., of Australia, is announcing the voluntary recall of about 427,000 Little Live Pets Lil Frog plastic toys. They operate with four button batteries and jump. Little Live Pets Lil Frog has SKU: 28217 and Lil Frog Lily Pad has SKU: 28218 printed on the frog's lower belly near its left thigh with a manufacture date code under it. The date code range is WS112016 to WS123216. The toy frogs were sold in pink, blue and green colors.

Problem: When the button batteries are removed from the toy frogs, the battery's cap can become a projectile and the battery's chemicals can leak, posing chemical and injury hazards.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the toy frogs, refrain from opening the battery compartment and contact Moose Toys for a free replacement Little Live Pet product. Release Number: (#17-096) Little Tikes, of Hudson, Ohio is announcing the voluntary recall of about 540,000 Little Tikes 2-in-1 Snug 'n Secure Pink Toddler swings. The swings have a pink T-shaped restraint in front with a Little Tikes logo. The swing is suspended by four yellow ropes. The model number 615573 is molded on the back of the swing seat and there is a manufacturing date code stamp on the back of the seat. The molded INNER arrow of the date code stamp points to "10", "11", "12" or "13", it is included in the recall. In addition, swings with a date code stamp of "9" on the INNER arrow combined with "43" or higher number stamped on the OUTER are included in this recall.

Problem: The plastic seat can crack or break, posing a fall hazard.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled swings and contact Little Tikes for a refund in the form of a credit towards the purchase of another Little Tikes product. Release Number: (#17-098) S.R. Smith LLC, of Canby, Ore., is announcing the voluntary recall of about 800 Helix pool slides. This recall involves Helix residential pool slides with serial numbers from SR-HX13-01001 to SR-HX13-01488 and SR-HX14-01001 to SR-HX14-01602. "S.R. Smith," "Helix" and the serial number can be found on the product label located on the top right side of the slide near the staircase rail. The recalled slides are 7-feet, 4 inches-tall at the highest point and have a helix (corkscrew) shape to its slide or flume.

Problem: A child can fall off the side of the slide before reaching the pool entry point, posing a fall hazard that can result in serious injury.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled slides and contact S.R. Smith for a free slide rail extension kit that will increase the height of the rail sides. Consumers can install the extension kit or contact S.R. Smith for a one-time, free installation of the kit. You can contact S.R. Release Number: (#17-099) Dillard's Inc., of Little Rock, Ark, is announcing the voluntary recall of about 1,800 Faux-Fur Hooded Bear Coats. This recall involves the Starting Out Baby Girls 3-24 Months Faux-Fur Hooded Bear Coat with style numbers F64CI801I and F64CI801N. The coat is labeled for children aged 3-24 months and has metal snap closures. It is an ivory faux fur coat with animal ears on the hood. The "Starting Out" logo and style number can be found on the tag sewn into the garment.

Problem: The metal snaps on the jackets can detach, posing a choking hazard to children.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled coat and return it to the nearest Dillard's store for a full refund. To obtain a prepaid envelope to return the product by mail, customers can contact Dillard's.
