Overview

The UPSBI course is designed to provide emergency first responders and school staff with the skills to plan and respond to school bomb threats and bombing incidents through lectures and exercises.

Participants are presented with information necessary to recognize and assess threats to determine school response actions; evacuation and shelter-in-place considerations.

Recommended Audience: Law Enforcement and School Staff.

Learning Objectives

- Identify the purpose and function of a school emergency management plan including the four phases of emergency management.
- Recognize warning signs of aggressive behavior.
- Identify response actions based on scenario types and bombing hazards.
- Identify Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) and their components.
- Recognize school security measures and training components necessary in an effective school bombing response plan.
