EXECUTIVE ORDER #246

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff on Memorial Day

WHEREAS, the long tradition of honoring our veterans on Memorial Day has been observed ever since the Civil War; and

WHEREAS, in May of 1868, General John Logan, commander in chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, called for an annual observance to decorate the graves of fallen soldiers, in order that no "neglect, no ravages of time, testify to the present, or to the coming generations, that we have forgotten, as a people the cost of a free and undivided Republic"; and

WHEREAS, it is right and proper that the people of Wisconsin remember and honor all of our service members who, throughout our long history, have sacrificed their lives in defense of the United States of America and the great State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, this Memorial Day, families and friends throughout Wisconsin will unite in honoring the courageous men and women who valiantly defended our Nation; and

WHEREAS, federal law provides that the flag of the United States should be flown at half-staff from sunrise until noon on Memorial Day; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Day will be observed on Monday, May 29, 2017;


NOW THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the constitution and laws of this state, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin beginning at sunrise on **Monday, May 29, 2017**, and ending at **12:00 PM CDT** on that date.
