
STATE of WISCONSIN

WHEREAS; under third-year Head Coach Paul Chryst, the Badgers are the only undefeated major college football team and have won two-straight Big Ten West division titles; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin is led by sophomore quarterback Alex Hornibrook, standout freshman running back and potential Heisman Trophy candidate Jonathan Taylor, and the top-rated defense in the country; and

WHEREAS; after they beat Ohio State, the Badgers should earn one of four spots in the College Football Playoff, in January, for the chance to win the first national championship in the heralded Wisconsin football program's history; and

WHEREAS; all Wisconsin Badger fans are encouraged to wear red on Friday and on Saturday for the game;
