EXECUTIVE ORDER #46

Relating to a Special Election for the 7th Congressional District

WHEREAS, United States Representative Sean Duffy, representing Wisconsin's 7th Congressional District, submitted his resignation to the Secretary of State, effective September 23, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TONY EVERS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article I, Section 2 of the United State Constitution and Section 8.50 of the Wisconsin Statutes, order that a special election shall be held on January 27, 2020, to fill the vacancy in the 7th Congressional District as described in Section 3.17 of the Wisconsin Statutes. The term of office for the 7th Congressional District will expire at noon on January 3, 2021. If a primary is necessary, it shall be held on December 30, 2019. Circulation of nomination papers for candidates may begin today, September 23, 2019, and nomination papers shall be filed no later than 5:00 p.m. on December 2, 2019, in the office of the Elections Commission, 212 East Washington Avenue, Third Floor, Madison, Wisconsin. These elections shall be held, conducted, canvassed, and returned in accordance with law.
