WHEREAS; every year, Veterans Day presents all Wisconsinites and all Americans with the opportunity to recognize those who have served, and to thank them and their families for the sacrifices they have endured on behalf of the people of the United States; and

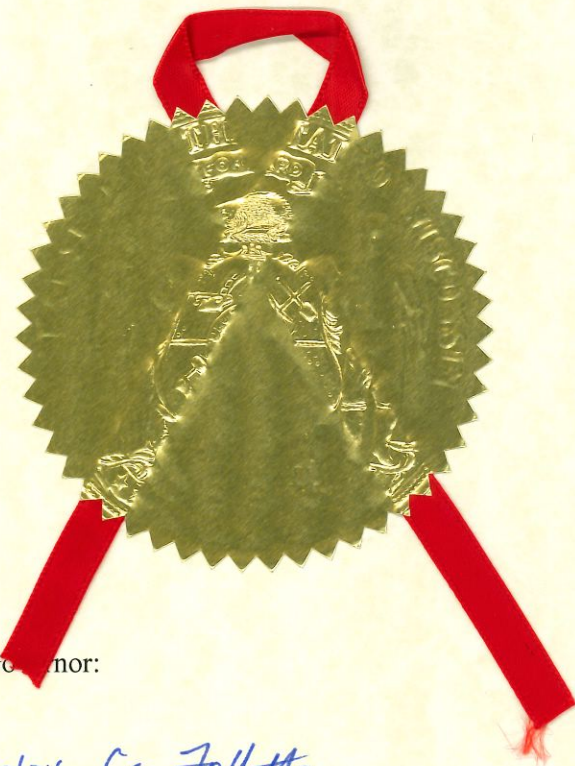
