EXECUTIVE ORDER #147

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Battalion Chief Sean Slowey of the Milwaukee Fire Department

WHEREAS, on December 11, 2021, Battalion Chief Sean Slowey, passed away at the age of 68 after a battle with brain cancer related to his service;

WHEREAS, Battalion Chief Sean Slowey devoted over forty years in service to the Milwaukee Fire Department and the State of Wisconsin;

WHEREAS, firefighters and first responders across Wisconsin will forever look to Battalion Chief Sean Slowey's legacy for guidance, inspiration, and strength;

WHEREAS, Battalion Chief Sean Slowey dedicated his life and career to bravely protecting the people of Milwaukee;

WHEREAS, Battalion Chief Sean Slowey was a loving father and brother and the people of Wisconsin collectively mourn his death; and

WHEREAS, the people of the State of Wisconsin and the City of Milwaukee are forever grateful for the service, selflessness, and sacrifice of Battalion Chief Sean Slowey of the Milwaukee Fire Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TONY EVERS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State, hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on Friday, December 17, 2021, and ending at sunset on that date.
