EXECUTIVE ORDER #281

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff on National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day

WHEREAS, on the morning of December 7, 1941, a devastating attack on the United States Naval Base at Pearl Harbor took the lives of 2,403 Americans, including more than 50 service members from Wisconsin, and wounded more than 1,000 others;

WHEREAS, the surprise attack drew the United States into World War II, during which over 300,000 Wisconsinites served in the Armed Forces;

WHEREAS, since 1994, the United States Congress has designated December 7 of each year as "National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day" to commemorate this solemn day and honor the individuals whose lives were lost; and

WHEREAS, on this occasion, the state honors and remembers the heroism, valor, and bravery shown by dedicated service members, including those who lost their lives in the attack on Pearl Harbor, recognizes the enduring legacy of veterans and their families who served and continue to serve the country, and carries forward a debt of gratitude to our nation's heroes for their enduring work to preserve and protect the rights and freedoms we hold dear.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TONY EVERS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State, hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the state of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the state of Wisconsin, beginning at sunrise on **Sunday, December 7, 2025,** and ending at sunset on that date.
