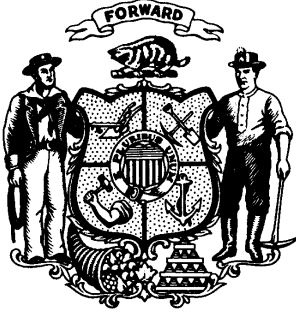

2025 WISCONSIN ACT

AN ACT *to amend* 946.70 (1) (a), (b), (c) and (d); *to create* 946.70 (1) (intro.) of the statutes; **relating to:** classification of the crime of impersonating law enforcement officers, fire fighters, and certain other emergency personnel and providing a penalty.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 946.70 (1) (intro.) of the statutes is created to read:

946.70 (1) (intro.) Except as provided in sub. (2), whoever does any of the following is guilty of a Class I felony:

SECTION 2. 946.70 (1) (a), (b), (c) and (d) of the statutes are amended to read:

946.70 (1) (a) ~~Except as provided in sub. (2), whoever impersonates~~ Impersonates a peace officer with intent to mislead others into believing that the person is actually a peace officer ~~is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.~~

(b) ~~Except as provided in sub. (2), whoever imper-~~

~~sonates~~ Impersonates a fire fighter with intent to mislead others into believing that the person is actually a fire fighter ~~is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.~~

(c) ~~Except as provided in sub. (2), whoever impersonates~~ Impersonates an emergency medical services practitioner, as defined in s. 256.01 (5), with intent to mislead others into believing that the person is actually an emergency medical services practitioner ~~is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.~~

(d) ~~Except as provided in sub. (2), whoever impersonates~~ Impersonates an emergency medical responder, as defined in s. 256.01 (4p), with intent to mislead others into believing that the person is actually an emergency medical responder ~~is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.~~
