EXECUTIVE ORDER #302

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Eau Claire Fire Department Firefighter Bryce A. Jungbluth

WHEREAS, on July 31, 2026, Eau Claire Fire Department Firefighter Bryce A. Jungbluth passed away in the line of duty at the age of 27;

WHEREAS, originally from Hayward, Jungbluth proudly served the Carrboro Fire-Rescue Department in Carrboro, North Carolina, for four years before joining the Eau Claire Fire Department in June 2026;

WHEREAS, Jungbluth was passionate about his profession, and his willingness to learn, serve others, and support his fellow firefighters will not be forgotten;

WHEREAS, in his final act of generosity, Jungbluth gave the gift of life through organ donation, which is a testament to his compassion and commitment to serving others;

WHEREAS, in the wake of his passing, the people of Wisconsin join Jungbluth's family, friends, and colleagues in mourning his passing and honoring his service; and

WHEREAS, services for Jungbluth will be held on Monday, August 10, 2026, in Hayward, Wisconsin.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TONY EVERS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State, hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin, beginning at sunrise on Monday, August 10, 2026, and ending at sunset on that date.
