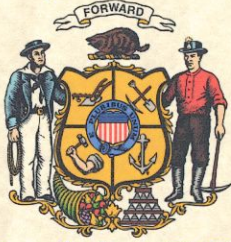

Proclamation

WHEREAS; Wisconsin Firefighters Memorial Day takes place on October 10, 2026, and is recognized each fall as a day to remember the firefighters Wisconsin has lost over the course of the year; and

WHEREAS; to date, the names of more than 350 fire and EMS personnel are engraved on the Memorial Wall of the Wisconsin Fire & EMS Memorial in Ben Hansen Park in Wisconsin Rapids; and

WHEREAS; on September 26, the memory of all those who have made the ultimate sacrifice as members of the state's fire and EMS services was honored with a Final Alarm Ceremony at the Wisconsin Fire & EMS Memorial Park to provide comfort to family members, friends, colleagues, and loved ones and assure them that the service and sacrifice of their fallen hero will never be forgotten; and

WHEREAS; this year, special recognition is given to the families, loved ones, and colleagues of Firefighter Daniel P. Cashin of the Milwaukee Fire Department, Firefighter/EMR Amie Sue Lee of the Van Dyne Fire Department, Lieutenant/Paramedic Tyler Kreiter of the Green Bay Metro Fire Department, and Firefighter Louis Fifarek of the Marinette Fire Department; and

WHEREAS; on this occasion, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in honoring the courage, selflessness, and sacrifice of the heroes across the state who served their communities and who lost their lives;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim October 10, 2026, as

WISCONSIN FIREFIGHTERS MEMORIAL DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
