Pursuant to Article 3, Section 7 of the Wyoming Constitution and Rule 18-1 of the Joint Rules of the Senate and House of Representatives, the Presiding Officers of the Senate and House of Representatives poll the membership of the Wyoming Legislature to determine whether the Legislature should be called into Special Session. A simple majority of both houses is needed to call a special session: 16 Senators and 32 Representatives. Not Voting is the equivalent of a No Vote.
