Children in Care Celebration Event

The annual Children in Care Celebration Event took place at St James School on 10 March 2017. This year 398 children and young people were nominated, that's approximately 100 more than ever before! 144 children and young people actually attended on the night, each bringing 1 or 2 guests. All the certificates and gift vouchers not presented at the event were posted out to the young people. It was an amazing evening with lots of food stalls and entertainment, eg. magicians, balloon modellers, face painters, a fun photo booth and driving simulator.

Devon Adopter Voice

Devon Adopter Voice Forum is a group of adoptive parents who meet regularly with the adoption support managers of Devon Adoption and Families for Children to ensure that adopters' views are taken into account by local adoption agencies when planning their future adoption support services. We also identify key issues that we may want to lobby or campaign on to bring about changes in government services, whether at local or national level eg. use of the Pupil Premium Plus in schools, CAMHS, or the Adoption Support Fund.

This project is part of the wider Adopter Voice project being run across the country by Adoption UK on behalf of the Department for Education. This involves online forums in each Local Authority area, and face-to-face forums in a number of pilot areas. Any issues we identify will be fed into Adoption UK so they can take them forward as part of the national project.
