INSURANCE FOR MALICIOUS DAMAGE

Where a foster child deliberately causes damage to the property of a foster carer, carers can seek reimbursement for the cost of that damage through an insurance policy provided by the Fostering Service to cover just that eventuality. There is no need for carers to first apply to their own insurance companies. It is a standard claims process and should be quite straight forward. It covers all property (excluding vehicles).

Incidents need to be reported within 30 days of the damage and the claim should be made via the child's' SW. If any difficulties arise, refer to Luke Chapman (Operations Manager), without delay.
