People from Birmingham, Coventry, Stoke, Rugby, Cannock, Solihull, Tamworth and Telford are coming together during spring 2022 to learn to tap dance, whilst also listening to each other's stories and experiences.

On 18 June we'll take to the streets of Birmingham for a world record attempt at a mass 'shim sham', a dance known as the national anthem of tap.






All that stands between us and a new anthem is a player with a table tennis bat. Terrapin's new work for Birmingham 2022 Festival combines the ideas of young Tasmanians with the fast pace and competitive vigour of table tennis.

Tasmanian children have written their own Australian national anthem, recorded by the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra. It speaks of their community, their dreams and their vision of the country.

However, to unlock the anthem, participants must battle an increasingly defensive table tennis robot, hell-bent on protecting the old hymn. Visitors to the Commonwealth Games will step up to the plate and reveal a fresh word from the updated anthem with each successful return, testing their skills and their commitment to the children of Tasmania.
