

## Wisconsin National Guard Testing Support -- Quick Start Guide

<b>Definition</b>	As part of the regional allocation of WING support, Counties and Tribes can submit requests for 1- to 2-day sites that will recur weekly or biweekly at the same location.	As part of the regional allocation of WING support, Counties and Tribes are still able to submit requests for WING testing support to respond to outbreaks. This could include outbreaks at long-term care facilities, jails, or workplaces.	As part of the regional allocation of WING support, Counties and Tribes are still able to submit requests for WING testing support on an as-needed basis. This could include setting a limited-time community testing event in an area that is seeing higher positivity rates.	As part of the regional allocation of WING support, the SEOC is working with stakeholders in three HERC regions to establish 3-day recurring community testing sites. These sites will be established in the following HERC Regions: Northwest, North Central, and Western. Specific sites are still in development.	Enduring Sites are those that operate continuously at the same location (e.g., MS). The state currently has four enduring sites in Dane, Milwaukee, and Winnebago counties.
